From the desk of our Pastors . . .

Happy New Year! I have high hopes for 2017 as there are a lot of changes in the future. Some of those changes will be at church. Others will be in the community and of course there are things that will be different for the nation. Change can be difficult but it is inevitable.

Some change we actively seek – like getting rid of bad habits or starting good ones. Last week in this newsletter I mentioned getting rid of 496 items to simplify my life. This week I have also decided to start eating healthier and lose some weight. Specifically my goal is to lose 496 ounces. By doing the math, which is 496 divided by 16 (there are 16 ounces in a pound), it's the equivalent of 31 pounds. So my goal is to lose 31 pounds this year.

I can't imagine how much lighter I will feel with all that weight just gone. But it is nothing compared to how much lighter I feel when I give everything that burdens and weighs me down to God.

Isaiah 58:6 says, "Is this not the fast that I have chosen: to loose the bonds of wickedness, to undo the heavy burdens, to let the oppressed go free, that you break every yoke?" God does not want any of us to be weighed down with heavy burdens, guilt, shame or regret. He wants all of his children to be free of all our issues and concerns.

So I am inviting you to join me in another "496 exercise" this year. Can you hand at LEAST 496 burdens that you have over to God this year? Whether it's "big stuff" like health or relationship issues or "smaller things" like a big test or car problems (and what is big or small is a personal choice), God wants us to come to Him with all of it and give it to Him to carry.

So let's decide to lighten up this year and give our biggest weights – our burdens and issues – to God. To God be the glory forever and ever.

#### What is Code Purple Sussex County?

At Avenue we are a cold weather shelter hosting men overnight during the coldest nights of the year. Our church has been hosting Code Purple guests for approximately 6 weeks. We started out opening our doors when the temperature dropped to 32 degrees and below. Now we are open every night regardless of the temperature. We have helped 26 men in total throughout these 6 weeks, many of whom have been regular guests along the way. At the moment we average 10-12 homeless men each night. While there have been some growing pains along the way, we have most definitely become a family. We are an eclectic and diverse group of individuals, guests and volunteers alike, ebbing and flowing together, giving each other grace and love, amid boundaries and mutual respect. Some nights flow easier than others, but every night is an opportunity to shine light into the darkness and I am quite certain these men know that they are loved.

We all have amazing opportunities each and every day to touch a life. Opportunities arise at work, at school, at the store, on the street...everywhere that another human being is in our presence. We can plant seeds and breathe life into each other with every interaction. Those of us involved with Avenue's Code Purple would LOVE for you to stop in to our corner of Avenue any evening to get to know our guests. Come and spend time getting to know them as individuals. See past what you "see". Resist the labeling and the judgements, and look into the eyes of those in your presence to truly see the humanity in front of you. Come and help us plant seeds of light and hope and love. Many of our guests are relatively young and not seasoned at homelessness. They come with a variety of backgrounds and reasons for their situations. They need Godly mentors to love them on their journey.

Code Purple is about so much more than providing them with a meal and a place to sleep... it is about building relationships with men who are hurting over their past, it is about letting them know they are valuable, and that hope is alive. It's about walking alongside them as they work toward improving their circumstances. As Matthew Barnett puts it, <u>we must meet their needs</u>, <u>but we must minister to their potential</u>. That cannot happen unless trusting relationships are formed.

Our area of greatest need is for overnight volunteers. We cannot provide our service without growing our number of dedicated, open hearted overnight volunteers. Before you decide this is not possible for you, at least come and participate in pouring love and hope into these men. You may be surprised at how easily your heart will connect with theirs. Join us any evening after 6:30. The doors unlock for guests to come in at 7 pm. Come spend some time with us....I think you will be very blessed by your fellowship with these men. Each night's interactions vary, but we have shared many tears, hugs and laughter. God has blessed many conversations, and we have witnessed the guests ministering to each other. It has been a beautiful growing experience for us all.

Areas for volunteering include intake, preparing meals, morning relief and overnight. **Of course, everyone can participate through prayer.** Pray specifically for the men that God has brought to our care, and pray specifically for the dedicated volunteers that have already given so much to this ministry.

To sign up for volunteering positions, go to the website above and find the online calendar link. It is not the friendliest to navigate the first time, but after you do it once, you will get the hang of it. Choose the date and the position you are interested in under Avenue's listings and plug in your information. We operate on 2 intake, 2 overnight and a dinner provider each night. Morning relief each morning is also very helpful as an extra pair of hands and feet.

If you are unsure, but feel a nudge toward this ministry, you can visit us any night without committing yourself as a volunteer. We will show you how things are run and you can get to know our Code Purple family. You can decide how you best fit into this ministry after your visit.
