From the desk of our Pastors . . .

There was a story on the national news last week about a potential shortage of maple syrup. Because the weather has been so warm there has not been as much sap produced as there has been in past years. According to one of the farmers who was interviewed, he would normally have enough sap to make 800 gallons of maple syrup in a colder winter. This year he has only been able to produce 200 gallons.

I am not a huge fan of foods that require syrup like pancakes, French toast and waffles. However, the minute I heard that maple syrup could be in short supply, I found myself craving pancakes in the worst way. I am already counting on making numerous trips to the kitchen on March 12 when we have a pancake breakfast at church.

It made me wonder how I could be so easily tempted. Just the thought of maple syrup was enough to make me rationalize my desire for large quantities of pancakes. That made me think about other parts of my life when I am tempted by things or situations that I really don't want or need. I just don't seem to have any willpower.

Willpower is difficult to harness. How many times do we wish for more self-control especially during Lent when we try and "give something up" as a type of spiritual practice. Whether it is sticking to a diet or workout program or trying to quit smoking or cut back on shopping, most people wish they had more self-control.

It is not something that we can wake up one morning and say "that's it, I will have complete self-control from this moment on." It is a spiritual practice and like all habits that we try and incorporate into our lives, it takes time and effort. We also need a good teacher and coach and we have the very best in the Lord God. Thankfully, He is with us every step of the journey as we grow into being stronger with our wish and desire to live in Godly ways. Titus 2: 11-13 says "For the grace of God has appeared, bringing salvation to all, training us to renounce impiety and worldly passions, and in the present age to live lives that are self-controlled, upright, and godly, while we wait for the blessed hope and the manifestation of the glory of our great God and Savior, Jesus Christ."

As we go through Lent, let's take time every day to think about those areas of our lives where we need more self-control. By removing our focus on those things that do not bring glory to God, we can work to refocus on growing into the people God has created us to be.

Persevering Prayer

Jesus told a parable about a man who was in need of bread to serve some unexpected guests. The man went to the home of a neighbor and continually knocked on the door until the neighbor got up and gave him the bread he needed. Jesus concludes the parable by saying "ask and it shall be given to you, seek, and you will find; knock and it will be opened to you." (Luke 11:9). Does this mean if we ask enough times we will get the answer we want? Does this mean that God is a sleepy neighbor who will not respond to our needs until we nag him to the point of annoyance? Does this mean that everything we ask for will be granted like a celestial mail order house? The answer to all of these questions is "no." God loves us too much to allow our prayers to be answered in any way but in the best way. Though it is difficult to watch a tragedy and question why God does not intervene, the meaning of prayer has much to do with the "sifting of the wheat" of our souls during the process of prayer than the "getting" the answer we seek. It takes time to pray. Prayer is slow work, as is the molding and shaping of our wills to God's will. It takes time to pray and as we do, our prayers can come into alignment with God's will so that we pray in the Spirit of God, rather than our own human desires. It means that prayer needs to be a lot more listening and a lot less talking.

I often find myself on conference calls using a toll-free number to connect various callers onto one conversation. One of the rules of conference calls is to use the "mute" button when you are not talking so that background noise does not interfere with the conversation. When the "mute" button is pressed your voice cannot be heard but you can listen. As we pray we need to put the "mute" button on and listen to what God is saying about the things we are praying about. God's perfect will sometimes is for us to wait and sometimes it is a different plan altogether, and sometimes the answer is "no." In the act of persevering prayer we hear back from God. As we do we can often find that disappointment is an appointment to a better plan given to us by the loving hand of God who cares enough to give us the best answer.
