

Health Care

Recently health care has been in the news and in our hearts. Regardless of culture, religion, race or gender, we all have health. And we have all experienced an injury or illness. It's a part of being human. And health care is central to Christianity. One of the names given to Jesus is "Christ the Great Physician." And with good reason. We hear repeatedly throughout the Gospels about Jesus healing people. He did so without regard to religion, social standing or their ability to pay. He sent out his disciples to preach the Good News and to heal the sick and he calls us as his 21st century disciples to do the same.


The United Methodist Church has a long history of following Christ's command by addressing health care needs across the globe. John Wesley, our founder was keenly interested in health and wrote a book of health advice (*Primitive Physick*) and one of his "Simple Rules" calls us to "Do No Harm" (a vow taken by medical doctors). Our hospitals, other health organizations and local churches have a commitment to ensuring access to health care. Indeed, drawing from our faith, the General Conference of the United Methodist Church has declared, "health care is a basic human right."

We have decided, as a society, to provide health care to people through a system of health insurance. The rate of uninsured people is the lowest it has ever been. More than 20 million people gained health insurance in the last few years, but millions remain without access to affordable health insurance and care. More needs to be done to ensure that everyone can access this basic human right.

However there is much conversation happening right now that seems to be about how to cut health insurance coverage, not expand it. Instead of helping more people, it appears we're trying to help fewer and fewer in order to lower costs. Our elected officials are even talking about changing Medicaid and potentially abandoning people living in poverty.

We are at a critical juncture as a nation. We can decide which path we want to take. Do we want to create a society where health care is rationed based on income? Or do we want to follow God's vision and Jesus's call to care for all of God's people?

Pray for our legislators as these decisions are being made. Call or write to them and share your ideas and concerns.
