From the desk of our Pastors . . .

Now that I have my Fitbit, I have spent hours strolling around Milford. Some of you have said you have seen me out walking in the mornings as I attempt to log my daily 10,000 steps. It is also a great way to look at the exteriors of the houses and being an HGTV fan, I find that kind of thing interesting.

But there is one house that really puzzles me. I won't tell you where it is located because it will be like a scavenger hunt if you too are a town walker. The mat that leads to the first step of the porch says "Due to the shortage of ammo there will not be a warning shot." Yet on the porch there is a hand painted sign that says "Jesus" and a cross hanging on the front door. Talk about mixed messages.

1 Peter 2:9 says "But you are a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, God's own people in order that you may proclaim the mighty acts of Him who called you out of darkness into his marvelous light." In other words, those who claim to believe in Christ need to act like it.

It makes me wonder what God's children who don't know Jesus as Savior would think about the front of this home. Would the people looking for Christ in this world fear being shot by the residents of this house who obviously know of Jesus on the cross? What does that say about being a Christian?

I am not judging the residents who live here. There could be a million reasons for the different statements that are being made via the mat, sign and cross and it would be irresponsible speculation on my part to try and figure it out. And let's be honest. We all fall short of God's will in our lives at times. The good news however is that we have the opportunity to start fresh whenever we find ourselves getting off the path that God has created for us. When we sin, we need to confess it to God and then make every attempt to not do it again. Sometimes it takes more than once for us to get it right but that does not mean we should ever stop trying to act and witness in ways that brings the love of Jesus to the world.

I saw a great quote the other day that says, "Your life as a Christian should make nonbelievers question their disbelief in God." What a wonderful way to think about it. If we used that ideal as a way to be accountable for what we do, say or think I wonder how much our lives would change.

If that was our house, would that door mat disappear and the Jesus sign and cross be more obvious? Would all people – believers and nonbelievers – recognize us as disciples of Christ by the way we live our lives? Let us dedicate our time on this earth to acting in such ways as to bring glory and honor to God for all the world to see.

God bless the Babushkas


Recently I had lunch with two United Methodist pastors from Russia who are visiting some of their supporting churches.

The place of the church in Russian in the 21st century is better than in the past when the Communist revolution swept into the country. But according to the Christian Science Monitor, Russia as emerged nowadays as the most God-believing nation in Europe.

The missionaries I spoke to credit much of this to the babushkas, who kept the faith alive during the state-sponsored repression. They were the grandmothers, with head-scarves and wrinkled faces, who were dismissed and ridiculed by the Communist leadership because of their religious belief. But they refused to give up their faith and kept it alive in secret and through their witness.

As we think about mothers during this Mother's Day weekend we need to reflect on the faith that women, mothers and grandmothers often bring to a godless world. Often it is the quiet voice that is the most tenacious and strong. I give thanks for those faithful women in Russia who never gave up on their faith in God.

Never underestimate the power of your faith, even when you are seen as insignificant, misguided or old-fashioned. It will strengthen, sustain and save you in the end, giving you victory when all else fails and has fallen away.
