From the desk of our Pastors . . .

Two weeks ago I took a whirlwind trip to Wyoming. I flew out on Wednesday and came back on Friday. I left again on Sunday, August 28 and returned on August 31 from a quick trip to Detroit. Over the next 12 months I will be using my vacation time and days off to do some consulting work.

So why am I doing this? Actually, it's not just me who is undertaking this effort.

Together, with five other former associates who are doing the same thing with their vacation time and days off, we will be doing the best we can to support the clients of a friend of ours. Over the past 10 years this friend has built a very robust small communications agency which specializes in media training, focus group moderation, and crisis management.

The reason for this backfilling is that he is being deployed to Afghanistan for a year where he will serve as the chief public affairs officer (PAO) assigned to the General in charge of the NATO forces. As you can imagine, without some TLC his clients would be forced to seek assistance with other public relations companies and by the time he got back his business could be decimated.

I'm not giving names since his deployment is considered dangerous and it is best not to put that information in the public domain, even on a church website. I can tell you that he is a Captain in the Navy Reserve who is being considered for promotion to Admiral. He has served this nation for more than 30 years in the active and reserve Navy. Those of us who know and love him could not stand the thought of his business, which he built from the ground up, having to be rebuilt because he took time off to serve his country.

During the time he will be gone he will miss birthdays, anniversaries, holidays and all the milestones of his first grandson who was born just a few days ago. Giving up my "fun" vacation to travel around the country and keep his company viable seems like no sacrifice at all compared to what he will be doing.

As I write this, I am currently only on contract for 26 days of work over the next 12 months. Clearly my role will be small compared to the others who have a lot more vacation. While it may become more than 26 days, and I hope it does for the sake of my friend's business, only God knows what is to come. It won't be two days a month. It will likely be three days at a time considering travel schedules but then it won't be every month either. And it will be with clients who work a normal business week so I don't anticipate being gone on any Sundays.

I struggled with this as I thought about what it meant for my work load. The good news is that I am way more productive on planes. I managed to finish the stewardship letter, this midweek, a sermon and a couple more odds and ends while winging my way across the friendly skies to Wyoming and back. But then I remembered what is written in the Gospel of John 15:13. "Greater love has no one than this, that someone lay down his life for his friends."

My friend is willing to do that for every one of us as he spends a year in Kabul. Giving up a trip to Disney World seems trivial in comparison. If I can help him by writing a few press releases, moderating a couple of focus groups, and training executives on how to work with the media than I will do it.

Please keep him in your prayers as he prepares to head off to combat duty training and then over to Qatar before jumping to Afghanistan. Please also pray for his family as they deal with his departure and year-long absence.

From the desk of Bishop Johnson . . .

The Dakota Access Pipeline Protest

According to "Dakota Access Facts" (dakotaacessfacts.com) the "Dakota Access pipeline project is a 1,172 mile, 30 inch in diameter pipeline that will connect the Bakken and Three Forks oil production areas in North Dakota to Patoka, Illinois. This will enable domestically produced crude oil from North Dakota to reach major refining markets in the US. It will transport 470,000 barrels per day of oil."

There has been an outcry from the Native American community about this pipeline. According to ABC News "The Standing Rock Sioux Tribe is challenging the US Army Corps of Engineers' decision to grant permits at more than 200 water crossings in four different states for the pipeline." Since the pipeline would be placed less than a mile upstream from the Sioux reservation this could negatively affect drinking water for 8,000 members of the tribe and many more who depend on this water downstream. An environmental group known as "Earthjustice" said that the project violates several federal laws, including the "National Historic Preservation Act." There will be a hearing in Federal court next Wednesday and until then the pipeline construction has been put on hold. The Standing Rock Sioux tribe has been joined by other American Indians and non-Native people from around the country.

"It's a familiar story in Indian Country" according to Native American David Archambault II (New York Times Mobile 8/24/16) "This is the third time that the Sioux Nation's lands and resources have been taken without regard for tribal interests. The Sioux peoples signed treaties in 1851 and 1868. The government broke them before the ink was dry. When the Army Corps of Engineers dammed the Missouri River in 1958, it took our riverfront forests, fruit orchards and most fertile farmland to creak Lake Oahe. Now the Corps is taking our clean water and sacred places by approving this river crossing."

This is not just a Native American problem, if a water supply becomes tainted with oil, everyone will suffer. I ask that all of us pray for this situation.




