From the desk of our Pastors . . .

Fall kickoff came and went last weekend and we are now into the full spectrum of activities here at Avenue. I am excited about the trajectory we are on over the next few years to make disciples for Christ. There are great things happening here as evidenced by the full calendar, the number of events taking place, an increased demand for meeting space and a vibrant energy infusing the entire congregation. The Holy Spirit is moving!

What inspires me the most however is the introduction of the new worship service on Thursday evenings. The first service will be tomorrow night, September 22.

There has been a lot of discussion about whether this will be a "relief valve" for the overcrowding at 9:30. The answer is both yes and no.

Everyone is invited and encouraged to be part of this new worship. The need for a service focused on people who cannot make it on Sundays has been increasing especially given the availability of public transportation and the number of people who work on Sunday.

But this service is not contemporary worship – part two. Thursday night worship will be shorter, contemplative, reflective, and the music will be more eclectic with cultural flares and genres that are not part of any current service. As it is being held in Fellowship Hall there will not be an organ. The praise team is not participating as an entity as it does on Sunday. Musicians and vocalists will come in and out over the different weeks based on the theme of the service and the musical needs for the evening. The most important element of this service however is the opportunity to worship God in an unique and different way as part of community. So I hope you will put it on your calendar for Thursday evenings at 6:30 p.m. As you discern whether you will be able to join us, keep in mind the words of Psalm 100 which reminds us why and how we are to worship.

Make a joyful noise to the LORD, all the earth.
Worship the LORD with gladness; come into his presence with singing.
Know that the LORD is God.
It is he that made us, and we are his; we are his people, and the sheep of his pasture.
Enter his gates with thanksgiving, and his courts with praise.
Give thanks to him, bless his name.
For the LORD is good; his steadfast love endures forever, and his faithfulness to all generations.


