From the desk of our Pastors . . .

I love and occasionally dread when the Holy Spirit is so obvious with spiritual promptings. There have been several times over this past week when it became obvious that the subjects kindness and consideration needed to be addressed and then a dear pastor friend sent me the copy she was planning to use in her midweek. I have set aside what I wrote (probably coming your way next week) and have enclosed this from Rev. Heidi Hill.

When I was a child, my mother and father would each take me along on pastoral visits – mostly to older people who could no longer attend church. Looking back on it now, I was probably a nice diversion for everyone. This was the time when little girls wore starched dresses, patent leather shoes, and white gloves, and sat quietly. Children, of course, don't just sit quietly - for me, it was an opportunity to observe, and share in a type of communion. Among my favorite people to visit were Miss Pond, and her companion, Miss Silver, because they always acknowledged my presence. While my mother was talking with them, Miss Silver graciously would set up a little footstool and a tiny table nearby with a cloth napkin, a tiny spoon, a demi-tasse of warm milk, a bit of sugar, and with my mother's permission, a taste of tea – just enough to make the milk not so white.

Times change, but forty years later I was reminded of that scenario when a person came into the office building where I worked, and after a while, said, "You know, I could never work with the public. How do you do it?" "I just try to be kind to everyone," I replied. It was a simple answer, and yet so much more.

There are over thirty references to kindness in the Bible. God is kind to us, and in turn, Proverbs 19:22, informs us that God expects us to be kind and loyal. Similarly, Jesus asks us to be kind to others – all others! In the Matthew

22:1-10 marriage feast parable, where the king invites all on the main streets outside, both good and bad, to the feast, my father described this kindness in a sermon as demonstrating a "strengthening love, a restoring love. A new love! A young love! A powerful love!" Jesus challenges us to "love your enemies, do good, and lend, expecting nothing in return. Your reward will be great, and you will be children of the Most High; for he is kind to the ungrateful and the wicked. Be merciful, just as your Father is merciful" (Luke 6:35-36).

Jesus challenged Simon Peter to acknowledge his love of the Lord by feeding his lambs, taking care of his sheep, and feeding his sheep (John 21:15-17 NIV). How can we act with this kindness? Especially when loving and being kind to our family and friends is sometimes easier than being kind to strangers and enemies. How do we become more than indifferent bystanders? How do we become more like the good Samaritan? Just a thought – if we take the time to listen to and accept the people around us; if we can practice setting aside our misunderstandings, hurt, anger and hatred, and pray for our "debtors" and those who "trespass against us," we can let kindness, what Paul calls a fruit of the Holy Spirit (Galatians 5:22), show God's love in all that we say and do.

From the desk of our Conference Director Vicki . . .

Amazing

This week, my daughter, Joy, had all four of her wisdom teeth surgically removed. Although she tried to be brave, she felt very nervous over the procedure. In fact, when the nurse inserted the IV, Joy began to cry. The doctor asked why she was crying: "Does something hurt?" She replied that her tears came from nervousness, not pain. Later, as I drove her home, she told me that she cried because she had last seen such medical equipment for my father, before his death. Although she knew her procedure was simple, the release form claims that death may result from the anesthesia.

However, as she regained consciousness from the anesthesia, she repeatedly exclaimed: "They were **amazing**! You all are **amazing**! The doctor is **amazing**!" Even after the numbness wore off and she began to experience some pain, she reaffirmed: "They were all *amazing*!" In spite of the pain, Joy could appreciate the role the doctor and nurses played in her healing process. She praised God's healing power before the healing is even complete.

I found myself reflecting on that incident during our Cabinet worship today. We read from Mark 5:21-42, where Jesus begins to go to the home of Jairus, whose daughter lay dying. On the way, a woman, who had been bleeding for 12 years, reached out and touched his hem, and received healing. Jesus paused to affirm her faith: "Daughter, your faith has healed you."

Because of the delay, however, people came to tell Jairus that his daughter had died. Jesus, instead, encouraged Jairus: "Don't be afraid; just believe." So, although people laughed at Jesus' insistence that she simply slept, he took his three closest disciples and the child's father and mother into the room with the little girl. After Jesus commanded her to get up, she rose and walked around. Those with Jesus responded with *amazement*!

Do you know how *amazing* Jesus is? What has Jesus done in your life this past week that left you amazed? If you cannot think of anything, ask yourself why? Has Jesus not done anything amazing this past week? Or have you simply not noticed it? Or

maybe, you feel too embarrassed to say it. (My daughter was, after all, still feeling the effects of anesthesia. She may not have responded the same way otherwise.) Maybe we feel too embarrassed that we need healing. Perhaps we would rather, like the woman in the crowd, touch Jesus' garment anonymously. Or maybe, we listen to the messengers all around us who tell us that it is too late. Nothing can be done now. May as well just leave Jesus out of it.

We can expand this line of questioning beyond our personal lives, too. We can ask about the future of The United Methodist Church. Perhaps we have listened too much to the naysayers around us, bemoaning that: "The church is already dead, torn apart. It's too late. Nothing can be done now. May as well leave Jesus out of it." We can also expand it to politics. Maybe we think that our country has become too divided, beyond the hope of helpful dialogue to move us forward. Since we think all hope is dead, we refuse to invite Jesus into those places of fear and death. Instead, we hunker down with people who think the same way we do and avoid going out into the crowd of people who may disagree with us.

But, these two people experienced *amazing* healing precisely because they heeded Jesus' invitation: "Don't be afraid; just believe." The woman ventured out into the crowds of people who might have condemned her as unclean in order to be healed. The parents refused to listen to the naysayers who predicted only death and destruction, and followed Jesus to the place of their pain in order to receive new life for their daughter.

Now what about you? How would you describe the *amazing* work of Jesus in your life this week? Imagine what would happen if all of us who follow Jesus went about our daily lives proclaiming: "Jesus is *amazing*! Look at what he did for me." Then, maybe more people would experience that Jesus can banish fear and death. Let's watch out this week and prepare to be *amazed*.
