From the desk of our Pastors . . .

Friends, it's again my turn to take over the Midweek. Pastor Wendy has been gracious enough to share space with me because I, in turn, wanted to share about a couple of things that are on my heart. Unfortunately, I am a much slower writer than Pastor Wendy, and so we have a special Thursday edition this week, my apologies for the delay.

Without further ado, enjoy the Midweek

The Election:

I don't know about you, but I am so relieved that the election is finally over. Whether you are elated with the results or disturbed by them, one thing is crystal clear. Our country is very divided and it will take intentionality and mercy and compassion for us to all come together. We will not all agree on the direction that our country should head but I hope that we can work together at the local, state, and national level. I pray that God uses the leaders that were elected to help the people of our great nation be the best that they can be. Jesus would expect no less.

Church Council Meeting:

Church Council met on October 26 to review and approve several item. The meeting included reviews by me, Finance, Trustees, and SPRC, but primarily focused on two items next year's budget and the tentative Code Purple shelter here at Avenue.

2017 Church Budget:

The bulk of the Council meeting focused on the 2017 church budget. We reviewed the numbers recommended by SPRC, Finance, and the Leadership team. These were discussed and approved. I have attached a copy of the budget and a list of leaders here at Avenue to the back of the Midweek.

The budget was constructed by the Finance and Leadership teams over the course of two months after extensive consultation with the Trustees and SPRC. We started the process by examining the tithes and offerings for the last two years. For the program years, 2014-2015 and 2015-2016, we saw approximately \$612,000 come in for both years, including all Sundays and other income streams. We then applied this to the 2017 projections for cost and sought to create something balanced. The process gave us a budget that is slightly in the red, but we are praying that through the Eternal Gifts sermon series and the growth that we have seen in people who have been coming to Avenue over the last few years, we expect to close this small shortfall by the end of next year.

I do want to highlight the changes that have impacted our new budget and will affect things around the church in the next year.

First, SPRC has redone the job description of the minister of music role. This role is moving to part-time, 30 hours per week, and will be focused strictly on the music and musical groups within the church. This was done for both financial and missional reasons. As good stewards, we take the responsibility of spending church funds very seriously. Missionally, based on the survey that was done in 2014, the congregation wants us to primarily focus on the following, in this order:

- 1) Pastoral Excellence (including 2 full-time appointed pastors)
- 2) Youth
- 3) Local Outreach and Evangelism
- 4) Worship & Music
- 5) Missions

I believe these priorities align with Wesley's vision for the church, and are supported by Biblical and theological principles. The leadership of the church, the invitation to salvation to our youth, and local outreach and evangelism, worship, and missions are all clearly supported by the Great Commission (Matthew 28:19-20), the growing faith of the believers in the book of Acts (Acts 2-8), and the various letters that make up the New Testament (1 & 2 Corinthians, Colossians, 1 & 2 Timothy, and James). The congregation desires nothing more than a vibrant and thriving church, and these

priorities will help us do what we need to in order to reach the people of Milford and beyond. Music, while absolutely vital to the worship experience, is only a part of what Avenue offers. We are committed to investing our limited resources in a way that aligns with the church's priorities.

There are also financial considerations that we need to take into account. With Pastor Wendy's position becoming an appointed one, as she pursues ordination, there are allowances and benefits that we are obligated to provide. In addition to this increase, there are serious problems with the new HVAC system that were discovered just recently. Changing the scope and hours of our music minister was a way to accommodate both the financial and missional considerations that we were facing. The decision to make the change to the music minister role was undertaken with much prayer and discussion. We all know that change is difficult and demanding. I ask that you continue to pray for and support Kevin as his role transitions in January of 2017.

Second, some line items have been added to the budget to help us invest in the priorities of the church. These include *confirmation* (to help our youth take ownership of their faith and participation in the church body), *special events* (to help us create space for new people to interact with the church body) and *missions* (to allow us to invest something in the work in the mission field). All of these enhance the work that we see God and Avenue Church doing in the world.

Third, we are investing in the facility. We have an amazing building that is utilized in so many different ways. I view the facility as a tool to help people know Christ and grow in Christ. Maintaining a 31,000 square foot building requires investment. The significant problems that we have encountered with the HVAC system will probably require \$10 to \$15 thousand in order to fix. This will have to be done if we want to be able to heat and cool the building, and we certainly will need that if we are to do ministry here.

Please review the material at the end of the Midweek and feel free to ask me about anything you see. We want our ministries to be as transparent as possible, and for you all to clearly understand what's happening at Avenue United Methodist Church.

Code Purple:

The Code Purple cold weather shelter was also approved by church council. Joyce Bonnoni and John and Kristin Elliott will be leading a group of volunteers who seek to give the homeless an alternative to sleeping on the streets in the cold weather. Currently, Avenue will be used to house only men. Women and children will be housed at the Multicultural Church at 105 NE Front Street in the Fisher Building

just a few blocks from church.


In-take will be from 7pm to 9pm. Intake will be done in the Fellowship Foyer with the guests then escorted to the Heritage Room where dinner will be served at 7:30pm. Dinners will be prepared off site and reheated in the church kitchen. Once dinner has been concluded, the furniture in the room will be removed and cots and blankets will be brought in for sleeping. The residents will have until 10pm to relax and prepare for bed Lights out will occur at 10. The guests will be awakened at 6am and feed a light breakfast. Then, the Heritage room will be reset for the day's activities, and the guests will depart by 7am. Much of the materials that we need for the shelter have been provided by Sussex County Code Purple.

Volunteers will be critical to the success of the shelter. We need people to stay overnight, help with dinner, do intake, and serve breakfast. We are actively recruiting individuals to help in all of these areas. We are inviting folks from within the congregation and community to come in and help us out. Joyce, John, Kristin, and I will be visiting other churches to invite them to partner with us on this project. We hope to make a significant impact for homelessness here in Milford.

Church Council approved support for a missionary coordinator, Kirby Schuler, who grew up here in Milford. We will be contributing \$25 per month to her work in the mission fields. She will be traveling in both the US and Central America over the next two years recruiting and training missionaries for service in Central and South America. We pray God's blessings upon Kirby and wish her well on her new adventure for Christ!

If you ever have questions about what's going on here at Avenue, please reach out to me anytime. The Kingdom of God is coming through the prayers and work of Avenue Church and I want to share the Good News with you and the rest of the world.

From the desk of our Bishop. . .

Much Work is Needed!

As we begin Native American Heritage month it is clear that there is much work needed in this nation of ours with regards to justice and healing with our Native American citizens. On the backdrop of the Standing Rock stand-off with federal officials over an oil pipe line we ponder once again the sad discrimination that is happening there. Native American people deserve to have the assurance that they have access to clean water and respect for their tribal burial grounds. These issues and many more broken treaties and injustices have created a lingering historical trauma in the lives of our First Nation people.


This is part of the reason that the teen suicide rate among Native Americans between the ages of 15 and 24 is more than double the national average. According to the Christian Science Monitor April 2015 edition there is a sense of hopelessness among young people because of alcohol and drug abuse, bullying, violence, high unemployment, poverty. The deep-seated issues that cause this include this history of trauma and genocide of native peoples, chronic government underfunding and the lack of equal access to opportunities for advancement.

Part of our Act of Repentance that we engaged in during our annual conference sessions included the acknowledgement of the inequities and the discrimination. But its main purpose was to call us to more work as the People Called Methodists to help, especially assisting the 1.2 million American Indian and Alaska Native young people in our country.

There is hope! Native American youth are resilient in many ways. They especially find support through the study and celebration of their traditions and cultural identities. Many such programs are springing up around the country and some include the learning of almost extinct tribal languages. We can be

supporting these efforts.

I encourage you all to study these complex issues locally in your churches, donate to the Native American UM Special offering, visit a reservation, find out where the Native American people live in your midst and hear their heart and their stories. Each one of us can do at least one thing. It is my hope and prayer that someday in the future the UMC will have its first Native American bishop. Until then there is much work that is needed!







Rarratt's **Celebrates** Francis Asbury's 200th

This year marks the 200th anniversary of the death of the man who probably did more to shape American Methodism than any other individual. Francis Asbury was born in England in 1745, but his career played out in America. From 1771, when John Wesley sent him as a missionary to the colonies, until his death in 1816, Asbury traveled well over 250,000 miles on horseback, formed connections with all sorts and classes of people, and took the lead in transforming a small religious movement into a fast growing church which would help shape popular religion in the new United States. More Americans had met Asbury than had met the President.

Although the world has changed greatly in the last 200 years, it is likely that Barratt's is one place where Asbury would still feel at home, because the building today appears much as it did in his day. Appropriately then, Barratt's Chapel is involved in the 2016 celebration of Asbury's life.

On November 13, the premier modern biographer of Asbury, Dr. John Wigger of the University of Missouri, will be speaking at the annual anniversary service. Dr. Wigger's recent book American Saint: Francis Asbury & the Methodists has received widespread acclaim. The service begins at 4:00 p.m. Mark your calendars and plan to attend!

Coombes House Designated Historic Site No. 512

A few miles west of Barratt's Chapel, along State Route 12, sits the Benjamin Coombes house, which was built in 1778. Although the Coombes family were Quakers, they befriended Francis Asbury, inviting him to



stay with them and to use their house as a preaching place. Asbury would sometimes stop there when he was traveling toward Barratt's.

The house is located on a working farm. The present owner, Joe Hughes, welcomes visitors by appointment. This site also includes a portion of the original 18th century road.

At its meeting in

June, the Peninsula-Delaware Conference voted to designate the Coombes house as a Conference Historic Site. The house is now included as Site #512 in a national listing of Methodist historic sites. A bronze plaque will be presented to the owner at a brief ceremony at 2:00 p.m. on Sunday, November 13. The public is invited to attend and tour the house. The Coombes house is located at 7320 Burnite Mill Road, Felton, Delaware.

Sunday, November 13th Tour Historic House and Barratt's Chapel

2:00 p.m. —The Coombes House will be dedicated #512 on the National Listing of Methodist Historic Sites because Francis Asbury sometimes lodged there on his way to Barratt's Chapel. It is the residence of Joe Hughes at 7320 Burnite Mill Road, Felton, DE. (Turn West onto Burnite Mill Road (Rt 12) at Felton. The house is less than 5 miles from Rt. 13), a working farm, with a portion of the original 18th Century Road. You are invited to tour the house, meet and greet various people serving in various historical capacities and the author and keynote speaker for the 4:00 p.m. Barratt's Chapel service. Light refreshments will be served. It's about 15 minutes to Barratt's Chapel.

4:00 p.m. —Barratt's Chapel will celebrate 232 years of Methodism and Francis Asbury, sent by John Wesley, a missionary, to the colonies, serving from 1771 to his death in 1816. Dr. John Wigger, of the University of Missouri, acclaimed biographer of Francis Asbury, will be the featured speaker at Barratt's Chapel. Avenue's Sanctuary Choir will be present. Dr. Wigger's most recent book is "American Saint: Francis Asbury and the Methodists".


