From the desk of our Pastors . . .

I admit that I am addicted to HGTV. For those of you who might not know what this is, it's the Home and Garden television station. The shows are about buying and selling homes, doing renovations, moving to exotic locations around the world, and finding that perfect beach house for a bargain.

One of the newer shows on this station is "Tiny House, Big Living." It is about people who are either downsizing or moving into first homes that are no larger than 500 square feet. The smallest one I ever saw was 82 square feet although to me that is not a home...it's a closet.

I do appreciate the desire to go simple and to decrease the amount of "stuff" that people have. One woman did something that I am going to emulate after the beginning of the year. For one month she got rid of the amount of things that equate to the day of the month. So for example, on the first of the month she got rid of one thing. On the second of the month, she tossed out two things. On the 15th of the month, she downsized by 15 items. I did the math and for a month with 31 days she would have gotten rid of 496 items.

That is going to be my New Year's resolution...to get rid of 496 things by the end of January. I have thousands of books so it would be easy to do just books but I am going to try and really get rid of the clutter and unnecessary things that take up space. Some things will be easy – like the bouncy seat that belonged to Chris when he was a baby or the jeans I have from college and will never wear again. I have a collection of plastic containers that are not only in my kitchen cabinets but are also overflowing into my basement.

At the moment it sounds like it should be fairly easy to do but I wonder how hard it will be towards the end of the 31 days. Something tells me I should not have much trouble finding 496 things to donate and/or get rid of but I also wonder how difficult it will be to get rid of them. Downsizing and simplifying in theory is a wonderful New Year's resolution but in reality I may find it difficult to actually let it all go.

The only way I am going to let go is to approach God and ask Him to help me give up those things of this world that I don't need and/or don't bring glory to Him. Instead I must get rid of those things that keep me from focusing on God. By simplifying and downsizing I hope to be less of this world and more in line with what the Lord wants for me.

Scripture reminds us, "Do not love the world or the things in the world. The love of the Father is not in those who love the world; for all that is in the world—the desire of the flesh, the desire of the eyes, the pride in riches—comes not from the Father but from the world. And the world and its desires are passing away, but those who do the will of God live forever." 1 John 2: 15-17.

It is the time of year to figure out what is important and decide what the critical focus of 2017 will be. Where will God be on your list of New Year priorities?

A Word about Camp


It is the darkest, coldest time of the year but that should not stop us from thinking about the months to come when spring will bring new life and sunlight and: CAMP! May my parting words in this 2016 be that of looking forward to outdoor Christian ministries that we so richly are blessed with in this annual conference through the ministry of Camp Pecometh. Our camp is a valuable vehicle for introducing young people to Christ, discipling them, challenging them to pursue a call to ministry and vocations in the church and engage in mission. It is also a place where care for creation is taught and Christian community is modeled. In addition our camp has year-round programs for all ages in retreat ministries of various kinds.

Camp Pecometh cannot exist without the support of our churches. We need monetary support but also volunteers to work at the camp, provide maintenance help, recruit and bring young people to camp and to pray for the camp. In addition we are asking that each church identify someone in every congregation who could serve as the "camp ambassador." They would be sent information about upcoming events and schedules and are asked to share this information at their local church. Many times information does not get down to the people in the pews and there are lost opportunities for service and camp utilization as a result. A final challenge is this: identify one young people who comes from a family of limited means and find a way to get them to camp. It can be a life-changing experience for them and you. Sometimes this requires helping parents fill out the application, providing all of the funding and actually driving the camper to and from the camp in order for them to participate. Many children and youth don't go to church any more but we can bring the church to them through our camping program. If every church would send one child like that we could reach more than 400 young people for Christ this summer and there is no telling what the fruit of these efforts will be.

In the midst of winter be thinking about camp. The possibilities are endless.
