From the desk of our Pastors . . .

Jeremiah 29:10-14

For thus says the LORD: Only when Babylon's seventy years are completed will I visit you, and I will fulfill to you my promise and bring you back to this place. For surely I know the plans I have for you, says the LORD, plans for your welfare and not for harm, to give you a future with hope. Then when you call upon me and come and pray to me, I will hear you. When you search for me, you will find me; if you seek me with all your heart, I will let you find me, says the LORD, and I will restore your fortunes and gather you from all the nations and all the places where I have driven you, says the LORD, and I will bring you back to the place from which I sent you into exile.

If you were in church on Sunday, you recognized the above scripture as the reading from our worship services. While the Holy Spirit always moves in the writing of sermons, we as pastors never know who will be affected by what is said. We understand that every person who hears us will take the message and reconcile it to what is going on in his or her life. Not every sermon will affect every person but as ministers we have faith that the right people will hear the right things at the right time.

Such was the case this week. For numerous reasons, all of which are unique, this scripture and the message that resulted impacted an unusually large

percentage of worshipers as evidenced by the number of people who have come to see me, called, or in other ways reached out to me. As I said in my sermon, write this passage down and keep it with you. I'm sending it to you now so you can print this out and hang it on the refrigerator, carry it in your pocket or purse, or put it somewhere that you can see it on a daily basis.

I'm not going to write much this week because nothing I can say is going to be as strong as this scripture from Jeremiah. I'm also adding the verse from Ephesians that I read. I hope you will keep both Bible verses close, in good and bad days, so that all the glory and honor can belong to God. Amen.

Ephesians 3:20 – God can do anything, you know—far more than you could ever imagine or guess or request in your wildest dreams!


"Don't Worry, Be Happy"

There was a song a long time ago by Bobby McFerrin that goes like this:

"Here is a little song I wrote You might want to sing it note for note Don't worry, be happy In every life we have some trouble When you worry you make it double Don't worry, be happy."

This might seem a bit simplistic or naïve or maybe even impossible, but these words are also a message from Jesus. On the "Sermon on the Mount" he says: "Therefore I tell you, do not worry about your life, what you will eat or what you will drink or about your body, what you will wear." (Matthew 6:25). We do worry because some things in this life are extremely fearful and they challenge our very existence. Looking around this world it does not take long to have concern about the endless wars in the Middle East, North Korean long-range missile testing, senseless mass killings, deaths of people of color by law enforcement officers and deaths of law enforcement officers, global warming, healthcare safety nets up for elimination in the senate, our denomination's conversations about unity. The list is endless. Did Jesus know all of this when he told us not to worry about our life? Some very bad things happen in life that do not get fixed up with a happy ending like in the movies.

Jesus takes us up on a mountain, above the sorrows and struggles of life, and tells us to "seek first the kingdom of God and God's righteousness." (Matthew 6:33) This is the bigger picture that goes beyond our present moment and lives on into eternity. Jesus knows about our sorrows. He was a "man of sorrows, acquainted with grief" (Isaiah 53:3) and he promises to be with us in our suffering. As we keep our eyes on the kingdom of God, even our hard times can be used for good. We can help others who are walking our journey of suffering with the empathy and support that only those on the path can give. We can look to the promise of heaven where all things are made right and justice prevails. This is our ultimate answer when the things of life cannot bring restoration and healing. We can work for justice and love while we are still here and will find true meaning and purpose in life as we do. It all comes down to faith. Faith is that which we cannot see but the substance of which we have full confidence. Faith gives us the patience, peace and hope for the future despite the fearful conditions of this life. Jesus reminds us not to worry like the Gentiles (who don't know God). So, believers: "Don't worry, be happy." God is with you.
