From the desk of our Pastors . . .

I was all excited about the new book I had picked up to read. It was a mystery set in a lighthouse that was being turned into a B&B. For me, it encompassed three of my favorite things — mysteries, lighthouses and anything to do with renovating old places. On top of that, the heroine liked to binge watch home improvement programs while eating potato chips, which is (sadly) something I have been known to do. As an added bonus, it took place in San Francisco which is a city I lived in for four years and I knew a lot of the places that were being referenced.

Based on what I read on the cover, and the few pages I had skimmed in the bookstore, I could not imagine a more perfect book for me. It turns out, I hated it and I could not have been more disappointed.

Everyone has disappointments in their lives. Some are small like this book which I wanted to like but didn't. Others are much bigger, like the loss of a relationship or a broken marriage. But the one thing that can never disappoint us is God.

While the old adage of "you can't judge a book by its cover" is certainly appropriate in this situation, I prefer to focus on what we read in Isaiah 55: 8-9. That says, "My thoughts are nothing like your thoughts," says the Lord. "And my ways are far beyond anything you could imagine. For just as the heavens are higher than the earth, so my ways are higher than your ways and my thoughts higher than your thoughts."

When we deal with disappointments, whether they be big or small, we just need to remember that God really does have a plan that is being worked in all ways for good just as we have heard in the past few weeks in Jeremiah 29:11, Ephesians 3:20 and Romans 8:28. God can take our disappointments and use them to teach us, put us in a place we otherwise would not have gone, and bless us in ways that are beyond our expectations.

It may take time and often it happens when we least expect it but keep waiting and praying and you will know when your prayers are answered. God does not want our disappointments to define us or weigh us down so we need to see joy and be thankful for all the Lord has provided every day, even when we are at our lowest.

You may not feel equipped to handle this on your own but God will give you everything you need to deal with it. God believes in you. We need to trust that God will defeat our disappointments, no matter what they are.

And to God be the glory forever and ever.

All I Need to Know About Life

A number of years ago there was a book entitled *All I Need to Know I Learned in Kindergarten* by Robert Fulghum. It includes some of the basics of life such as: share everything, play fair, don't hit people, put things back where you found them, be aware of wonder, hold hands and stick together, etc.

I would like to say that all I need to know I learned from Camping and Retreat Ministries in the Philadelphia Area. In the Eastern PA Conference we have Carson-Simpson Farm Christian Center, Gretna Glen Camp and Retreat Center, Innabah Program Center and Pocono Plateau Camp and Retreat Center. In the Peninsula-Delaware Conference we have the Pecometh Camp and Retreat Ministries. All of them teach the lessons that a life of faith can bring. In the Christian community modeled at our camps people learn how to share, how to be respectful of diversity, how to "hold hands" even when people think differently and to care for body of soul. Campers learn about the wonders of creation as they share time in the woods, in a lake, at the river, on a mountain. Campers hear the wonderful words of life in Jesus Christ and are called to accept Christ as Savior and Lord. Some receive their call to ministry and mission at camp. It is all we need to know.







This summer I was privileged to visit three camps. I got to see the wonderful Grand-parent and Grand-children Camp at Innabah, the Day program at Carson Simpson where sign language was taught and Deaf visitors from the Lighthouse Fellowship UMC came to see the young people sign songs. I also took part in a new camp at Pecometh where Deaf children and their parents came for a family retreat, as well as a week-long Deaf Adult Group Home camp. All of these camps were full of joy and activity. The giftedness of campers and staff created a time of personal and community. Worship and the stories of Jesus change lives and reach people who may not otherwise be at our churches on Sunday. This is important work and I urge all of our congregations to support our camps with your prayers, your presence, your gifts and your service. It is a place where we teach life and light.
