It is 9:15 a.m. on Wednesday, September 27<sup>th</sup> which means it's 8:15 p.m. on Tuesday, September 26<sup>th</sup> back home in Milford.

It's been an amazing trip and it would take days to write about what happened and hours for you to read it all. I'll just say for now that I have an appreciation for the Korean culture that I never expected to have. Their fervor for Jesus is humbling. Churches with several thousand members and costing tens of millions of dollars are common. I'm sure I'll be sharing stories throughout the year but suffice it to say now that I'm looking forward to getting home and sleeping in my own bed. I suspect with such a major time difference (and I did get my body reset to the Korean time zone), that jet lag will be lengthy and intense but I'm okay with that.

When I left I was feeling pretty lousy (still getting over pneumonia) and dreading a 14 hour flight in cramped quarters. Now I would not

have changed this experience in any way. God is indeed good all the time.
