From the desk of our Pastors . . .

My favorite season of the year is fall. I love the cooler temperatures, the changing leaves, and the menus that include chili, soup, anything that includes pumpkin and all things with apples. When I was younger my family and I would go apple picking and I have great memories of spending time in apple orchards.

My fondness of apple trees however was somewhat tempered by the "knowledge" that Adam and Eve had been disobedient to God by eating from an apple tree in the Garden of Eden. As a child, I didn't want to do anything that would make God mad, so I tended to avoid to eating apples for years.

It was my mom who finally pointed out that God never specifically said it was an apple tree. Genesis 3:6 says, "The woman saw that the tree was good to eat, and it was a desire for the eyes, and that the tree could pleasantly make one wise, and she took of its fruit, and she ate, and she gave to her husband who was with her, and he ate."

Many scholars think it may have been a fig tree because the Bible says, "they sewed fig leaves together" in Genesis 7 to cover themselves when they found they were naked in the aftermath of their sin. Fig trees are also typical for the part of the world that would have been home to those who first shared the story of Genesis.

Whether it was an apple or a fig tree doesn't matter. As the symbol of life and death, trees are representative of humankind. The symbolism of God planting trees in the Garden of Eden can't be ignored. Planting for the goodness of humanity should be a goal of every Christian. So let's emulate Jesus and plant!


From the desk of our Dover District Superintendent.....

FAN OUR EMBERS INTO FLAMES!

I like what Oswald Chambers said, "Prayer is not an exercise, it is *the life*." How is this life of ours alive? How is this life of prayer going in your personal and corporate dimensions as churches? Let me tell you how this life of prayer sustained and nurtured me, in spite of me or beyond me, by the touch of the Holy Spirit of God after I became a Christian. I was led to be apologetic about my Christian faith, often having been surrounded by my unbelieving relatives and parents who lived as atheistic almost Buddhists with their belief in Confucian teachings, before they came to believe in Jesus. I was a baby Christian back then. I had no clue how to respond to questions such as 'Why Jesus? or 'What does our prayer do?' In a spiritual environment where my beloved worshiped many different gods, God taught me a great deal about how to invite the Holy Spirit into every moment of my life through PRAYERS. Without praying, I might have been totally lost when I lived with different gods in my own family. Without inviting the Holy Spirit of God, who was deeply praying with sighs for me the helpless baby Christian, I would not have known how to practice my own faith in the face of different religions within my own family.

In the midst of different gods, you may wonder how I learned to PRAY in Jesus' name by invoking the Holy Spirit when I had no words prepared to defend my faith and no theological or spiritual foundation yet. The corporate prayer life of my home church, Chungdong Methodist Church in Korea, taught me about this life through 365 days of early morning prayer services at 5:00 am. I had been deeply blessed by the very strong corporate prayer life that held me accountable, giving me a message "Are you in need of God? here is a place where you can come. You've got to come to Jesus." My fellow Christians deeply grounded prayer life shaped my spiritual life. My spiritual growth was directed by my dedicated pastors who set a great example in their own personal prayer and corporate prayer life by leading early morning prayer services every day, Wednesday prayer and worship services, and all-night prayer vigils on Fridays.


I organized a spiritual pilgrimage to South Korea from September 19 to 27, 2017 by leading 28 pastors, laity and their spouses from the Dover District. When we were required to attend the 5:00 am predawn prayer services of the hosting church, I recollected my memories of how the repeated practice of regular and fervent prayers at early morning prayer services molded my soul and increased the desire to COME to the Lord. Early morning prayers served like preaching to me by the guidance of the Holy Spirit inside of me. You know sometimes the only preacher you need to hear from is the Holy Spirit inside of you. One pilgrim said, "I thought I would not be able to wake up at 4:00 am to attend the morning prayer. The more I practiced, the more I came to anticipate such intimate time with the Lord. I miss the early morning prayer where I met Jesus as a corporate body of about 1,000 believers at the Bupyeong Methodist Church in Korea."



I have been naming "hidden prayerlessness" in our churches. I've emphasized the 40-Day Prayer Challenge throughout the district. Churches and pastors who have held a prayer challenge have witnessed the need and blessings of a revived corporate prayer life. After the pilgrimage, six churches in the Dover District have committed to restoring their corporate prayer life by having early morning prayer services. My husband and I have been attending a 40-day predawn prayer service at Whatcoat UMC, Camden. Rev. Dr. Bo Gordy-Stith said, "What a fearful and wonderful thing it has been to leap headlong into God's arms in prayer each morning. I am still amazed at the way I can experience transforming intimacy with the Holy Spirit among the saints gathered around me in prayer in ways that are simply not possible when I am alone in my prayer closet." Then I attended the morning prayer service at Centennial UMC, Smyrna, where Rev. Rudy White led the Morning prayer service for his church people along with a challenging message. People cried out to the LORD in the morning! How beautiful and powerful it was!

Yes, it's time to *fan our embers into flames*! These words were the theme of the 4th Revival Prayer Day of the Dover District on October 21,2017. Since we initiated

the first revival prayer day in February 2016, we have seen this theme fulfilled among churches. The District prayer team came into being during the preparation for the 3rd Revival Prayer Day. They started the "Prayer Stole Ministry". They made prayer stoles to connect 102 churches in the Dover district and arranged for the stoles and prayer journals to travel from church to church. The lay leader prayed for the receiving church's pastor as he or she received the prayer stole and journal. The church was invited to write down their own unique prayer requests and cries to the Lord in the journal. The prayer team members knocked on the church doors to visit with pastors and lay leaders to share these traveling prayer stoles and journals and build relationships with them. No more isolation among us! At the




4th Revival Prayer Day, every participant received the district prayer booklet that is compiled of prayers from 102 churches. The prayer team calls the booklet "the Dover District Book of Psalms". The team created a "prayer loom" where the prayer stoles and all the prayer supplications from the churches were woven into the loom. Each Revival Prayer Day participant picked up one of the church prayer request cards during Holy Communion to pray for that church, along with their own, to make our churches CONNECTED and truly UNITED in the Lord. This ignited an amazing lay movement in our district. They say, "This tapestry of the Dover District's traveling prayer stoles and corporate prayer journals is not completed yet." "We got to work with the rising Holy Spirit amongst us!"

Let's choose "life" that is PRAYER!!! What habits and hang ups get in the way of this life of prayer? We've received the highest calling that the LORD is our life. It's time to REPENT, RECONNECT ourselves to the Holy Spirit, and RECOMMIT ourselves to the LORD through regular, fervent prayers.
