From the desk of our Pastors . . .

I hope and pray you all had a blessed Thanksgiving. My holiday took me to Kansas with Chris to spend the time with my sister, Jennifer, and her family. We were all there for a wonderful week, except for my youngest nephew who is still in Spain.

On Wednesday night I joined Jennifer and my niece Katie at the Center of Grace which is the facility that their church, Grace United Methodist Church, has built to feed the hundreds of people who line up there every Wednesday and Thursday evening for dinner. Working with the other churches in town, there is a free dinner every night of the week for those who need it. Grace UMC covers those two nights. On the night I was there, the volunteers served 267 people and I was told it was a "light night."

Jennifer introduced me as "her Pastor sister from Delaware" and I was honored to be asked to give the blessing after everyone was seated. That did however also identify me as someone who was available to provide pastoral counseling as needed.

The lesson I took away from that night is that it was a different location, different people than I know in Delaware, but the stories are remarkably similar. I spoke with several single mothers trying to provide for their children, a widower who comes just for someone to talk with each day, a

homeless man who wants to break out of the bonds of addiction, the bus driver who is a member of "the working poor" and the fast food restaurant worker who just wanted vegetables because she could have free deep-fried food, but she needed more in her diet.

But most importantly, I was reminded that our Jesus is always the same and what we are called to do never differs. I could have skipped going to this event as I was on vacation, but my heart didn't feel right trying to ignore this occasion to serve. Galatians 6:10 says, "So then, while we have opportunity, let us do good to all people, and especially to those who are of the household of the faith."

As we move into Advent there will be many chances to serve the Lord by what we do and provide to our brothers and sisters in need. I urge you to open your hearts to how the Spirit is calling you to share your blessings with others as we prepare to welcome Christ. We are all called to different ways of giving of our time, talents and resources but we are all called. As we go about our days, let's look for those opportunities to love and serve our Savior.

And in all ways, at all times and in all places, to God be the glory forever and ever.


Thanksgiving in all Circumstances

The hymn "Now Thank We All Our God" was written by a Lutheran minister, Martin Rinkart (1586-1649). We sing it often during this season of Thanksgiving. The backdrop was far from a Norman Rockwell Thanksgiving painting.Rinkart penned the words of this hymn during the Thirty-Years' War (between the Protestants and the Catholics. He was one of 4 parish pastors in Eilenburg, Saxony (East Germany) at the time but when the war continued to rage on one pastor left, two died and he alone served the people. Eilenburg was a walled city, so it became a place for refugees and there was a great shortage of food. Then the plague set in and scores of people died from this dreaded disease. He performed 40 to 50 funerals a day, including his wife and it was estimated that buried a total of 4,480 people.

After the plague there was an invading army of Swedes that demanded tribute. He served as the negotiator with the Swedish army, and paid them tribute with his own money. When the army refused to leave the town he gathered the people for prayer and miraculously Swedes departed in peace. Through it all Martin Rinkart gave thanks and this hymn was an expression of his trust in God despite the extreme hardship.

We too are called to faithfulness during life's trials. It is doubtful that we have ever experienced the tragedies that happened during the time of the writing of this beloved hymn but all of us face difficulties and suffering. The Apostle Paul tells us to "Rejoice always, pray without ceasing, and give thanks in all circumstances, for this is he will of God in Christ Jesus for you." (I Thessalonians 5:16-18)May God help us find our blessings in the hardships life brings us and when we look back later, we can reflect on God's providence and goodness through it all.

A WORD ABOUT THE NEW BLUE PARAMENTS

Why blue?

These beautiful paraments are blue, a color increasingly used for Advent in Protestant churches. Blue is the color of royalty to welcome the coming of a King. Blue symbolizes the night sky where the star appeared to announce the birth of Jesus. Blue can also signify the waters of Genesis 1 and the beginning of a new creation.

What do the symbols represent?

The symbol embroidered in the center of the altar parament is the Chi Rho (X P). It is composed of the first two letters in the Greek word Christos. The Greek letters, Alpha (first) and Omega (last) which flank the Chi Rho, symbolize Jesus as the Christ who has come and will come again, as well as the continuity of God's presence in human history.
