On Tuesday evening, I was blessed to have dinner with my friend Bill Salvin. If that name rings a bell it is because we have been praying for him for more than a year. Bill just returned to the United States after having spent a year on active duty in Afghanistan and this is the first time I have seen him since he returned at the end of October.

As you can imagine, he had a lot of stories. Some were funny, some sad, and a few were downright scary like when a car bomb that was 2-1/2 times bigger than the Oklahoma City bomb went off outside the gate of the building he was working in. The best part of the evening was when we prayed together to give God glory for bringing him home safely.

The major theme behind his time in country was that he recognized just how blessed he was every day that God kept him safe. As Bill put it, "It became clear very fast that I was not in control. As an officer I thought I was in some way in charge of what was happening. I quickly had to let go and place my trust in God because it was only through Him that I was coming home. It was my Father that I leaned on to get through".

Matthew 18:3 says, "Truly I tell you, unless you change and become like little children, you will never enter the kingdom of heaven." Bill had the experience

of war to teach him that lesson of becoming childlike again. We need to learn that lesson also. No matter how big or how small our fears, needs, and troubles may be, God is bigger than all of them and will be there to protect us during the ups and downs of life. We make it through every day thanks to the Lord's constant presence in our lives. As we head into this season of Christmas, let us give thanks to God for the best gift of all. The gift of Jesus and His place in our lives.

And in all ways, at all times and in all places, to God be the glory forever and ever.

# No Room in the (Church)

Many months ago, my son, who is 20, decided to try to go back to church. Like many young adults, he wrestles with the supernatural aspects of Jesus, although he loves the teachings, and loves the idea of the possibility of community in the church. He has started several conversations with our family when he is home, and I enjoy especially watching our daughter share her faith with him. On that particular Sunday back in the spring, he attended one of the churches which I had previously served. Upon entering the foyer, one member greeted him with these words: "What are you doing here? You do NOT belong here anymore." Sadly, that "greeting" kept Eli from returning to church until several weeks ago. As my daughter told him: "You may be giving up on God, but God will not give up on you," I felt grateful for the amazing prevenient grace of God who continues to reach out to us, encouraging us to accept and return that love.

Advent reminds us of the lengths to which God will go to express divine love to us. It also raises our awareness of the ways some aspects of the Christmas story continue to repeat themselves in our world today, i.e. threats from foreign powers, the need to count people, oppression in many forms, etc. Preparing my heart for the birth of Jesus anew, I heard this phrase spoken to my son in a new light: "There is no room for you in the inn." How many ways do we communicate to people that they do not belong or that there is no room for them in our churches? Sometimes, we judge how young people dress—they wear their pants too low or show too much cleavage or wear "pajamas." Other times, when they want to offer their gifts, we tell them: "That's not how we do things here," or we make them endure a byzantine approval process. Maybe we express the sentiment in terms of money: the older people or longer-term members pay for the church to survive whereas young people cannot give enough. Or we say we want young people but we fight any change necessary to serve them, or we simply "tolerate" their presence. People, both young and old, can detect inauthentic welcomes—ones which say, "You are welcome here as long as you think, dress, speak, and act like us." Once treated in such a manner, few people will give us a second chance.

Yet, the hope of Christmas shows up in those who, like Mary, say "YES!" to the inconvenience of new life; in those who would rather celebrate new life in a stable than have their neat and tidy inns. We do not play the role of helpless or innocent by-stander in this story. Instead, we have the opportunity to make room in our hearts, in our lives, in our relationships, in our

churches, for the presence of youth and young adults, who will make your life messier, but so much fuller of joy. Will we be the inn-keeper, insisting that there is no room, or will we be Mary who makes room no matter what the cost?

Our Minister in Residence of the Young People's Ministry Network, Rev. Megan Shitama Weston, recently sent me some information and ideas she had received at the National Youth Workers Convention. She pointed to a book put out by the Fuller Youth Institute, called, *Growing Young*. The book identifies six practices that help churches retain young adults. Megan would like to bring a speaker here to help us learn some of these practices. Those practices are:

- 1. They exhibit keychain leadership (willing to "share keys to the church").
- 2. They emphasize ministry with young people.
- 3. They take Jesus' message seriously.
- 4. They fuel a warm community.
- 5. They prioritize young people and families everywhere.
- 6. They are good neighbors to their communities.


Which of these steps do you think your church could take? How might God be calling you this season to open wide the doors of the "inn" and shout: "Welcome, Jesus! Welcome, all!" throughout your whole neighborhood? Where in your community do people feel overlooked? In what ways do people in your community feel pushed out to the margin, the stables and mangers? How are you living our mission of Cultivating [your community] through our CALL—Connecting (with the community), Acting (to demonstrate God's prevenient love), Leading (people to the stable to meet Jesus), and Loving (growing in grace)? May the babe of Bethlehem make us uncomfortable enough to change our ways!



#### A WORD ABOUT THE NEW BLUE PARAMENTS

#### Why blue?

These beautiful paraments are blue, a color increasingly used for Advent in Protestant churches. Blue is the color of royalty to welcome the coming of a King. Blue symbolizes the night sky where the star appeared to announce the birth of Jesus. Blue can also signify the waters of Genesis 1 and the beginning of a new creation.

#### What do the symbols represent?

The symbol embroidered in the center of the altar parament is the Chi Rho P). It is composed of the first two letters in the Greek word Christos. The Greek letters, Alpha (first) and Omega (last) which flank the Chi Rho, symbolize Jesus as the Christ who has come and will come again, as well as the continuity of God's presence in human history.
