From the desk of our Pastors . . .

I can't believe the Eagles are in the Super Bowl. I grew up in the Philadelphia area, living in Doylestown, PA from the time I was six months old until I left for college. I still consider Doylestown to be my home town. But over those years, my family watched as the Philadelphia teams – Eagles, Phillies, 76ers, and Flyers would all-too-often come so close to winning the championship, just to dash our hopes at the very last minute. The last championship for the Phillies was in 2008 (one of two), for the 76ers was in 1983 (one of three), and for the Flyers was in 1975 (one of two). The Eagles made two Super Bowl appearances, in 1980 and 2004, but have never won.

Philadelphia is long overdue for a championship in any sport. As much as my desire is for Philadelphia to win, I'm not going to pray they do. I will pray that it's a good, clean, safe game and nobody gets hurt. I will pray that the fans of the winning team don't do anything stupid after the game (especially necessary, I believe, in the case of a Philadelphia win). I will pray that the level of spousal abuse goes down to zero as that is the day of the year when more assault takes place than any other. But when it comes to praying for the win, I will only pray that the teams play to their level of preparation.

Praying is not a miraculous substitution for preparation. It would not have gotten me an "A" in seminary if I had only prepared at the "C" level. It would

not have landed me on the varsity tennis team if I was only prepared to play at the junior varsity level. And it will not hand the Eagles a win if they are not prepared to take on the New England Patriots and Tom Brady.

However, if the Eagles prepared harder, better, faster and were more ready to take on their opponents than the Patriots are to take on the Eagles, than that prayer will reflect on the performance of the team.

Normally I would add scripture to my article but no matter how hard I looked there were no biblical verses about the Super Bowl. (I'm open to suggestions if anyone has an idea.)

Lost and Found

Recently over dinner with our son, Eli, and his girlfriend, we told stories about being lost. One of the stories we recalled took place at Dorney Park. We had gone to the amusement and water park with family friends, and chose to go to the water park during the heat of the day. Eli, about nine years old at the time, got separated from us. Although our kids could swim, the crowded conditions added a sense of panic when we realized his absence. We began searching the water slides we had recently ridden, and the wave pool, where Eli had wanted to go. We thought we had retraced all of our steps. Then, we went back to a first aid station, which we had passed on entering the park. There sat Eli, calm, cool, and collected. We rejoiced to have found him and asked him how he felt.

As we were recalling the story, he expanded on how he felt that day. He said, "I went back to a place which was familiar, a place I knew. And, I waited patiently. I had no fear at all. I KNEW you would find me. I just had to stay put." As I listened to his words this time around, I heard the very simple and yet profound trust in us, as his parents, who he knew would find him.

Since that dinner, I have meditated on that simple trust as an invitation to go deeper with God and remind ourselves that we are not lost BECAUSE God will find us. If God knows where we are, how can we be lost? Psalm 139:7-12 reminds us that we cannot escape from God's loving presence: "Where could I go to get away from your spirit? Where could I go to escape your presence? If I went up to heaven, you would be there. If I went down to the grave, you would be there too! If I could fly on the wings of dawn, stopping to rest only on the far side of the ocean—even there your hand would guide me; even there your strong hand would hold me tight! If I said, 'The darkness will definitely hide me; the light will become night around me,' even then the darkness isn't too

dark for you! Nighttime would shine bright as day, because darkness is the same as light to you!" We can never be lost where God cannot find us!

What amazing grace to us today! We can easily give in to feelings of being lost. Our society seems to have lost its way, when we resort to name-calling on social media instead of listening to understand differences of opinion. Our schools seem to have lost their way, when we focus on punitive rather than rehabilitative means of addressing inequities and school violence. Our communities seem to have lost their way, when we choose to live in neighborhoods with people who agree with us, rather than getting to know someone different. And, our church has lost its way, when we would rather cause congregations to split apart along theological perspectives than learn to live together with our differences. Our church has lost its way, when we would rather cater to those within our doors than get to know and serve the neighbors outside of our doors. Our church has lost its way, when the things we used to do to "bring people in" just do not work anymore. We can very easily feel lost today.

Instead of running from place to place in our "lost-ness," perhaps we should follow Eli's example. Let's go back to a place where we know where we are. Let's go back to a "first aid" station and wait there for God to find us. What do we know for sure? We know that God knows us better than we know ourselves. (Psalm 139.) We know that God's love goes deeper than we can possibly imagine. (Ephesians 3:17-19.) We know that Jesus came to reveal God's glory to us, so that we could become one with them and so that the world would believe in Jesus. (John 1:14-18 and John 17:21.) We know that Jesus offered his life for us, so that we would not be separated from God, but would be born again. (John 3:16-17.) We know that the Holy Spirit lives in us and therefore we do not belong to ourselves. (1 Corinthians 6:19.) We know that God will always seek us out, just as God seeks out every lost sheep, and that God will find us. (Luke 15.) When we return to these "places" that we know, we find it easier to trust that God will find us. We cannot escape from God's love in Jesus Christ.

So, if you and/or your congregation feel a little lost as we peer into the future, go back to a place where you know, and wait. God will find you there. God will never leave or abandon us. (Deuteronomy 31:6.) Once God finds us, may we have the courage to follow the Good Shepherd as he seeks for others who have lost their way.

A WORD ABOUT GREEN PARAMENTS

Why Green?

Green symbolizes the promise of new life. It is used during Ordinary Time, a period where there is no special season. This includes the period between Epiphany and Lent, as well as the season between Pentecost and Advent. We will be using green paraments starting this Sunday until Ash Wednesday.

What do the symbols represent?

The three-petaled arms of the fleur-de-lis crosses are symbols of the Holy Trinity: Father, Son and Holy Spirit. The crown motif represents Jesus Christ, the Son of God, who is our heavenly leader or king.
