## Jonathan and Donna Baker—Missionary Newsletter

Praise God for the amazing team who recently joined us in the Democratic Republic of Congo! We truly believe their presence here has made a difference to the Congolese who cherish relationships with the United Methodist Church in the United States. As many of the team have shared, their hearts have been touched in profound ways and they have experienced a true transformation.

Did you know that in Congo Bishops receive welcome and greetings like royalty? It is amazing the respect given by the people as their visits always brought hope and encouragement. Bishop Peggy Johnson truly experienced that when she and Bishop Daniel Lunge climbed into chairs for the local men to carry them through the village of Wembo Nyama. What an astounding welcome while hundreds of residents waved palm branches, sang and trilled their delight in the honor of having TWO bishops in their village, the first female bishop ever seen by the central Congo Episcopal Area!



The entire team received honorable welcomes as well. District Superintends Dawn Taylor-Storm & Joe Archie, Rev. David Ryan, Rev. Bob Wilt and Director of Connectional Ministries Rev. Vicki Gordy Stith heard trills, songs and chants of joy in every location they had the delight to visit. People rejoiced in welcoming Ann Jacob, a seminary student, and Tony Barnett, the Chair of the Church Counsel in his local church. All were welcomed as "missionaries", people who had traveled far to embody God's love and hope.

A beautiful tradition in Congo is to demonstrate extravagant generosity to visitors so wherever the team went, they were showered with gifts of rice, fruit, chickens, and even goats! Often these were given by people who cannot afford to eat themselves such as a group of widows bring food to the team. How humbling it is to experience these acts of grace from our sisters and brothers in Christ.

Traveling far away, leaving family and jobs to a country known for violence and difficulties brings challenges. How did they find the strength to even board the plane? Trust! Trust in the Lord! As stated in Psalms 84:12, "those who trust, blessings will flow." And so many blessings flowed as every team member expressed their joy in experiencing the love and faith of their Congolese sisters and brothers in Christ! Here are just a few highlights of the wonderful experiences as a team.



After three years of financial contributions from the South District in the Eastern PA Conference, the Team had a chance to see first-hand the fruits of their labors at the Mpasa Medical & Nutrition Center. What a thrill to see the new Pediatric building and to hear, just after arriving, a newborn had been born and was using the new incubator! Feeding the children, welcoming members of the Elderly women's program empowering older women often shunned by society and meeting the dedicated staff at Mpasa were highlights of the mission. After feeding the children there and at Miriam's Table, the DS and the Mpasa Local Church hosted a lovely worship service. What a blessing!



Years of fundraising and planning were celebrated when water gushed from the earth in the village of Wembo Nyama last week! WATER IS LIFE! This large village in Central Congo with a population of about 82,000 has had no access to fresh clean water until this well drilling met success. Diseases related to the drinking of dirty, contaminated, bacteria infested water contributes to the largest cause of death, second only to the disease of malaria. Large crowds gathered around the workers as the rig reached the aquafer, about <u>150</u> feet below the surface. Praise the Lord! Jonathan and I dropped to our knees in joy as the team gave shouts of praise!



The School of Theology in Wembo Nyama has had a highly rated reputation over the years, especially since this village is the "Jerusalem" and the "Genesis" of Methodism in Congo which began in 1914 when the first missionary, Bishop Lambuth, appeared. Several of the team had the honor to teach classes to the students which brought such elation from the students. The library of this large school, contains only 200 books but some "solar Kindles" were recently provided by the General Board of Higher Education with hundreds of books on each for the students! Most students do not have access to the resources available on theology and Biblical history in developed countries. Therefore, the students raised many questions which the team articulately answered. What a blessing to so many! Thank you, Bob, Joe, Dawn and Jonathan!



David Ryan, the founder of the Children's Ministry in Wembo Nyama, provided a 'refresher course' for the teachers there who dedicate so much of their time to this ministry. In 2013, approximately 30 students and 12 volunteer teachers participated in the program. As of this current year, over 6000 students are reached each month in 45 groups spread out among the villages surrounding Wembo Nyama. The Congolese, under the leadership of Director Josephine, have developed this program on their own! We are always in awe of their creativity and zeal for their work, as they draw symbols in the sandy soil and teach the children to play-act and memorize scripture passages.



The team also experienced beautiful new improvements in programs of the Congo Partnership which now have new leadership as designated by Bishop Lunge. The farm in Diengenga now has planted new fields and the use of the grinders promoted throughout the communities provide an income moving the project toward self-sustainability. The Mama Tola Social Program for young mothers who had to leave school to raise their families actively recruits and trains the girls in vocational skills and parenting proficiencies.

Vicki Gordy-Stith had the honor of presenting letters and gifts to the Mama Tola School in Diengenga from the youth of Wesley UMC in Dover, DE, a program lead by her daughter, Joy. The students shared such elation that a church in the US still loves them and prays for them. The team members all received beautiful dresses and shirts made by the sewing program at Mama Tola. A special visit to the Jack & Renie Miner Trade school reminded the team how various projects are working together such as the Trade School training mechanics using the truck from the farm.



The team also experienced first-hand the major challenges faced by the central Congo with transportation and communication. Canceled flights, washed out roads, broken bridges and the cost to ship supplies from Kinshasa to central Congo were experienced by the team helping us better understand Bishop Lunge's transportation priority for his Episcopal Area.

We will never forget this very special time shared with the team who sacrificed so much to travel so far to develop relationships with the Body of Christ in Congo. Every life was transformed by the faithfulness of God's people in Congo. Our worship and devotional time brought such insight as so many expressed specific testimonies related to their experiences here. The Lord has abundantly sanctified the fifteen days of the team's journey and we believe these blessings will continue as they share their passion for Congo. Lusaka Efula! Merci beaucoup! Thank you!
