*From the desk of our Pastors . . .*

Last week's write up.....

As I am on vacation this week, I turned to my dear friend Heidi for this week's addition to the Midweek. Her writing is magical, so I hope you enjoy the "guest author" this week. To God be the glory forever and ever.

From Pastor Heidi:

How many times do we need the Holy Spirit in the role of the Rememberer? For me, that seems to be a huge role. The promised Holy Spirit was not only for the disciples, but is here in the world today, if we listen. As we observe Lent this year and remember all the challenges and trials that Jesus faced during his time in the wilderness, we, also, can take this opportunity to consider the challenges and trials in our lives within the context of listening with our whole hearts and minds to what our Comforter, Counselor, and Rememberer, the Holy Spirit, reminds us of God's promises. We, too, can face death, sickness, and whatever ugly distractions this world has for us, knowing that Jesus laid the groundwork for our faith, and promised that the Holy Spirit is here now to teach us and to lead us much further.


Jesus promised, "But the Counselor, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, he will teach you all things, and bring to your remembrance all that I have said to you. Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you; not

as the world gives do I give to you. Let not your hearts be troubled, neither let them be afraid” (John 14:26-27 RSV).

Those verses were particularly on my mind this month when our son was scheduled for total knee replacement surgery, after an unsuccessful partial knee surgery five years ago. The new surgery reminded me anew of the role of the Holy Spirit in our lives. In Kansas 2013, as my father was passing from this life, we learned that our son who lived on the island of Maui, Hawaii, was being medically evacuated to a hospital on another island, Oahu, due to severe complications with that knee operation. I was torn in two, wanting to be in both states. The words of John 14:26-27 came to me, and suddenly, I felt awash in God’s peace. My sister, Mary, who was on the phone with me during my father’s passing, was ready to listen, when I said, “I can let Dad go, but I am not ready to let Buddy go.” I was at peace with our father’s passing but did not want to deal with the possibility of our son’s passing the same day. In a further instance of the Holy Spirit at work, my father, in his passing, continued to be a mentor and counselor. There at his bedside with me was his dear care-giver and student, who sang, read scriptures, and promised my father that he would return to school and continue his theological studies (something my father had been encouraging him to consider for years). It was a sacred time, to be sure, full of the Holy Spirit.

Later in the chapter, Jesus said, “I will no longer talk much with you, for the ruler of this world is coming. He has no power over me; but I do as the Father has commanded me, so that the world may know that I love the Father. Rise, let us go hence” (John 14:30-31 RSV). It seems to me that there is great peace in loving the Father and living in obedience to his loving will.

## Women's History Month

Malala Yousafzai was born in 1997 and grew up in the northwest Swat Valley region of Pakistan. As a child she was fortunate to have access to education because her father, Ziauddin Yousfzai operated a private girl's school in her home town. This part of Pakistan was under Taliban rule and they did not believe that girls should have an education. When she was eleven years old Malala wrote a blog for the BBC describing what it was like living under Taliban occupation. This story appeared in a New York Times documentary and it got a good bit of attention in print and on television. She was nominated for the International Children's Peace Prize by Desmond Tutu.



Unfortunately, all of this attention made her a target of the Taliban. On October 9, 2012 she sustained a gunshot wound to the head by a masked Taliban gunman. Miraculously she survived the assassination attempt and was sent to England for treatment. This horrific act of violence against a young girl created overnight a huge outpouring of support for her cause. After her recovery she became an international speaker for the rights of education for all children, especially girls. In 2014 Malala was the youngest person ever to receive the Nobel Peace Prize. As a result of her advocacy the United Nations passed a petition in her honor that led the country of Pakistan to ratify the first ever "Right to Education" bill. She has established a non-profit organization that raises funds to provide education for girls and has written a number of books. In 2015 she opened a school in Lebanon for Syrian refugees.

Currently she is enrolled at the Lady Margaret Hall (college) in Oxford studying for a bachelor's degree in philosophy, politics and economics. There is no telling what she will be doing in the future.

I give thanks for this courageous young voice in our world who believes in the education of girls and all people. Many of our Methodist missions around the world focus on the education of girls and society has reaped the benefits of these efforts ever since. Only when everyone is respected as equal and equally able to access education, health care and the basic needs of life can the entire world thrive and be at peace. Malala is a shining example of a young person who has changed the world. We should never under-estimate the power of once voice, who bravely speaks out for justice and human rights. Happy Women's History month!
