Since we have been focused on the Holy Spirit over the past three weeks in worship, I wanted to send this article that my friend Pastor Heidi wrote in 2015. It may be a few years old but the message is evergreen.

To God be the glory forever and ever.

What an awesome gift is the Holy Spirit! We believe that Jesus Christ was conceived by the Holy Spirit (Apostle's Creed), and that "they will call him Immanuel (which means "God with us")" Matthew 1:23 (NIV).

Pentecost reminded us that Jesus, whose human life was bound to a time and place, went to be with God, the Father, and sent from the Father, the boundless Holy Spirit, the Spirit of truth: our Comforter, Counselor, and Advocate. If we listen, the Holy Spirit will guide us, patiently, unendingly, to the truth in the far reaches of the outer and inner universes that we come to understand.

It seems that we have just begun to understand a few bits of this truth out of the vast, overarching heaven of the love of God to us in Christ - and one way to better understand, comes from giving - through acts of kindness including prayer. James writes that "Every generous act of giving, with every perfect gift, is from above, coming down from the Father of lights, with whom there is no variation or shadow due to change" (James 1:17 NRSV).

Each day, I am grateful for all the proofs of God's gifts and acts of love and kindness that I see, and am joyful meeting the special people who cross my path. As I pray, I feel the Holy Spirit enfolding those on the prayer list, and am assured that "Grace, mercy and peace from God the Father and from Jesus Christ, the Father's Son, will be with us in truth and love" (2 John 1:3 NIV).

Annual Conference 2018


The 2018 Peninsula-Delaware Annual Conference has come and gone but we saw the Spirit move in amazing ways. Members from all of the United Methodist churches in Delaware and the Eastern Shore of Maryland gathered at the University of Maryland-Eastern Shore campus in Princess Anne, Maryland to continue the work of the church in our corner of the world.

On Thursday the conference opened in worship where all the members shared communion around their tables. The preacher of the day was Rev. Russell Ewell who is a blind member of the Missouri Annual Conference and pastor of The Village Church of St. Louis. He spoke on inclusion and the importance of that to Jesus' mission of calling everyone to faith. In the afternoon, the clergy executive session approved 3 candidates for ordination, including Rev. Jake Macklin, Helen Holleger's great nephew, and 6 candidates for commissioning, including our very own Rev. Wendy Owen. During the opening business session, Pastor Tom presented the Conference's statistical report with Rev. Tracy Mooney. The final session of the day focused on the work of the Commission on a Way Forward and the specially called General Conference in St. Louis in February, 2019. Rev. David Bennett and several other clergy presented a case for retaining the current language on human sexuality in the Book of Discipline, and Rev. Victoria Starnes presented a case for choosing alternate language. The members of the conference then had conversation around the table about their thoughts and hopes for the General Conference. At the end of the night Pastor Tom presented Resolution R-8 to set the minimum salaries for full-time pastors serving churches in the Conference. This is a part of his role as Chairperson of the Commission on Equitable Compensation. The resolution was amended but passed with the amendment.

The morning meeting on Friday was a teaching session led by Rev. Junius Dotson, the General Secretary of Discipleship Ministries. The session focused on creating an intentional discipleship pathway in local churches. In the afternoon, there was more business conducted by the Annual Conference which included passing the 2019 Annual Conference budget. After a moving monitoring report by Rev. Jenifer Kerby, the conference reiterated its support for

two efforts in the local churches of our area. The first was to openly discuss the work that the Commission on a Way Forward has done. Avenue will be having group discussions and study, led by Pastor Tom, in the fall to look more deeply at the issue of human sexuality. The second is to spend some time in worship focusing on the sin of racism in our community and culture. Pastor Tom and Pastor Wendy will be preaching on this topic after the start of the new year. Then after dinner came the Ordination Service where we prayed for all of the newest members of our conference, including Pastor Jake and Pastor Wendy!

Finally, Saturday's session arrived. The morning session focused on concluding any remaining business of the Annual Conference, including the presentation of Resolution R-9 by Pastor Tom. Representing the Advocacy Resource Team, Pastor Tom urged unity in the face of any decisions coming out of the 2019 General Conference, regardless of the results. After much discussion the resolution was amended from the floor to urge unity by keeping the current Disciplinary language. The amendment passed and then the amended resolution passed. The Conference was closed with a service of remembrance to recognize clergy families that lost loved ones during the course of the year. The preacher, Rev. Tom Carter, helped us see God's grace through the pain of loss by going verse by verse through Psalm 23.
