My current favorite is the BBC version that stars Benedict Cumberbatch and Martin Freeman.

I am a fan of Doyle's because we share a birthdate (102 years apart) and I would love to write novels that are as popular as his. That having been said, I must confess that until recently I had not actually read any of his books. I simply watched the movies and got enthralled every time one of the actors playing Sherlock would proclaim "the game is afoot."

But then I read one of his books and realized how much I had been missing. What was written was more creative, expressive and engrossing than any film version of his stories. I am truly sorry it took so long to enjoy the written word.
