Wednesday, January 16, 2019 From the desk of our Pastors . . .

As of January 16<sup>th</sup>, the government shutdown has been underway for more than 25 days. There is an up-to-the-minute count on the USA Today website if you ever need the specific details of this particular shut down.

More than 800,000 government employees are either furloughed completely or working without pay. Considering the average household in the United States is 3.1 people, that means more than two million people are directly impacted by not having a paycheck. Then there are the millions, including the 136,000 people in Delaware who are affected by the SNAP program (Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program) running out of money. People, including children and the elderly, are going to be hungry as a result. There are also the small businesses and other service providers and their employees who are being affected by less customers and fewer sales. I could give you many more examples of the ramifications of this shutdown, but I suspect you are already aware of the widespread impacts.

Whatever "side" you are on regarding the budget battle over the wall, I hope we can all agree that government workers, the communities that rely on federal employees for their economic health, and the millions of Americans who are supported by government programs should not be pawns in a political battle. People are being harmed and that is wrong.

The argument that there is a bigger principle at stake is true but it's not about a wall. It's about how the government is expected to treat its people and considering what scripture tells us, we are doing a poor job.

The biblical purpose of government is to care for and promote the good and protect the safety, security and peace of the people as Paul points out in Romans 13. Readings in Isaiah, Jeremiah, the Psalms, the Book of Kings reminds us that the government is responsible for caring for the poor and vulnerable and responsible for fairness and justice. That means Republicans, Democrats and Independents.

Many of you have asked what can be done to help those affected by the shutdown. Prayer is always needed. In addition, remember how stressed and worried people without paychecks and an income are going to be and let them cry, vent or express their concerns without getting into a political debate. Then simply ask what can be done. Everyone has a different story and need. By gently ascertaining what will be helpful, there will be an opportunity to support and care for our brothers and sisters who are impacted.

That is what Jesus is expecting of us - to care for each other in the midst of whatever the world gives. And in that way we can give God the glory and honor forever and ever.

# To know beyond the unknown By Bishop Peggy A. Johnson

NASA has sent a space craft far beyond Pluto that recently took pictures of a reddish rock that astronomers call "Ultima Thule" (which means "beyond the known

world"). This hunk of rock and ice stretches about 20 miles across and is about 6.5 billion kilometers from the earth.

Ultima Thule is significant, according to NASA, because it could offer us insights about what the solar system was like at its first forming. It could help scientists understand how the building blocks of planets were made 4 billion years ago.

On January 1 the New Horizons spacecraft sent back pictures—images the like of which we have never seen before. What is even more exciting is that this spacecraft has enough power to continue exploring the unknown universe for another 11 years. So, it



will continue traveling further out into space and take even more out-of-this-world pictures that we have never seen before.

As Psalm 19 rejoices, "The heavens declare the glory of God." How amazing is our God to have created so many vast planets and stars?



"When I look at your heavens, the work of your fingers, the moon and the stars which you have set in place," asks Psalm 8:3, "what is man that you are mindful of him and the son of man that you care for him?" Compared to all this vastness of space, we on this tiny planet might seem insignificant. Yet, God does love us and care for us as precious beings in God's creation.

Ponder the words of Ephesians 3:20: "Now to him who is able to do immeasurably more than all we ask or imagine, according to his power that is at work with us..." Or Romans 11:33: "Oh, the depth of the riches of the wisdom and knowledge of God. How unsearchable his judgments and his paths beyond tracing."

Yet, beyond the known world (to borrow our new celestial discovery's moniker) and beyond the new horizons emerging in our sciences, we know an unknowable God. We know this Creator who cares for all creation through mighty words and deeds, through a heaven-sent Son whose birth we celebrated at Christmas, and through our own faith in the reliable evidence of things unseen.

We may continue to journey far in our search and discovery of distant, unknown worlds. But the God we know is always near, listening and peering into our searching hearts, hearing and responding with love to our prayers of faith. Let us believe in that!
