Wednesday, January 23, 2019 From the desk of our Pastors . . .

Exodus 20:8 is a command from God that we rarely keep. This scripture says, "Remember the Sabbath and keep it holy." How many of us take a day and do no work?

It is the only command that starts with "remember." God must have known we would forget that one. We have become such a society of busyness that our "energizer bunny" mentality has become a badge of honor and we fail to follow the example of our Lord.

Even as a people made in the image of God, we somehow think that "resting" means we are weak or lazy. Yet God Himself rested after He created. Genesis 2: 3 is very specific as it tells us that "God blessed the seventh day and hallowed it, because on it God rested from all the work that He had done in creation."

Jesus rested too. Even though His time on earth was limited, He followed the example of His Father and rested. We hear in Mark 4:38 about how when the crowds were big and there was work to be done, Jesus was asleep in the boat when the disciples woke Him as they feared the sea around them. Jesus understood the need for rest.

So why then, when we are commanded to take a Sabbath and we have such

great role models for self-care, do we refuse to do it ourselves? (And take note that the Sabbath is different than a day off if we use our time away from the office/work/school to do laundry, catch up on cleaning the house, and grocery shop. That becomes a personal work day.)

Rest is important in your spiritual journey. Studies show that people who take a true Sabbath are healthier, more capable of handling stress, and are more productive in the long term. God also blesses those who honor the Sabbath by affirming our obedience to Him, inspiring and revealing the Savior to us, and freeing us from the false idols and addictions of busyness.

As we begin a new year, working hard to get our bodies, finances, careers, health and many other issues into better shape, let us remember that we need to do a better job of following ALL the commands that God has given to us, including the one to keep a Sabbath. And to God be the glory forever and ever.




