Healing Wounds

We think some kind of bug bit our goldendoodle, Wesley, on his hind right paw. It began as a small red spot. However, Wesley started licking it and would not leave it alone. Despite our best efforts at soaking his paw and covering it with a sock, his paw eventually got infected. Now, we have to give our poor boy an antibiotic twice a day and he has to wear the "cone of shame." He tolerates it pretty well, but he could have prevented it by not messing with the bite in the first place.

How I wish this type of thing only happened to dogs! But, we humans do the same thing, don't we? While we do not lick a physical wound, we do nurse our grudges. We get irritated by some small slight, and we play it over and over again in our minds. Then, as we grow angrier, we begin to tell others about it to justify ourselves. We gossip and back-bite until the wound has become infected and begun to infect others around us. (See Psalm 41:5-8.) We have all heard it: "Did you hear what Pastor Soandso said? Can you believe that?" The rumor spreads and grows and begins to infect the body of Christ. What began as a misunderstanding or even a hurtful comment from which we could learn has become a tumor eating at the heart of community.

Years can go by and still we nurse that grudge. We still badmouth the person who we believe hurt us. We think we have justified reason to be angry. But we do not realize we not only continue to harm ourselves but also the very temple of Christ here on earth—the church. Wesley's paw began to hurt him so much that he limped, which impacted the rest of his body. He could not run as fast and did not even look forward to his walks. Now that he is healing, his excitement for his normal play and daily walks has returned. So, in the church, when we allow this infection to grow, we harm the ability to live the purpose God created for us—to make disciples for the transformation of the world. Who wants to hear a message calling them to change their lives and hearts if they do not see our lives and hearts changed? (See Luke 3:3-6.) We also see this dynamic playing out in our global United Methodist Church. You all know about the Special Called General Conference at the end of February. (You can read about it here.) I hope that you all have included the deliberations in your prayers.

Our Conference Spiritual Formation Team is creating prayer vigil resources for us to pray together. Too often, however, we have gotten into the very same "licking our irritants into infections" habit with this topic, as well. We demonize people on the "other" side of the conversation, with comments such as: "They don't care about the Bible;" or, "They do not have any compassion for people." As our hearts and communities become infected with ill-will for each other, we lose our ability to "walk in the way that leads to life." (See our Baptismal Vows.) We no longer make disciples or transform our world. After all, who wants to join an infected body?

Perhaps we need to don the "cone of shame" to prevent our mouths from licking the wound with harmful words. The book of James exhorts us: "Know this, my dear brothers and sisters: everyone should be quick to listen, slow to speak, and slow to grow angry." Can we confess that we have often been quick to speak and slow to listen? Maybe we also need to take the antibiotic of Jesus' love and grace and mercy several times a day, so that we begin to see that the same grace which covers us also covers our "enemy." We might then experience the healing of the wounds of our church and begin to offer that healing once again to our world. Perhaps then, we can become "Connected Christians offering the hope of Jesus Christ to today's world." I am willing to try it. Will you join me in this effort to become a healing body for our world?
