From the desk of our Pastors . . .

As Michael and I are on vacation in (hopefully) warm and sunny Florida for a few days, I am turning to my dear friend Pastor Heidi for her words this week. As always, she brings a wonderful lesson.

Early in elementary school we learn about colors: what they are and how to make them. Red plus blue equals purple. Blue plus yellow equals green. One day the teacher asked, "Where do the colors come from?.. From white or black?" I was among the students who answered, "Black," having ruined a number of paintings by mixing all the colors together. Surprisingly, she said that the colors come from white. Hmmm...then, she held up a prism, and suddenly, from the sunlight coming through the window, the colors of the rainbow danced around the room. What excitement there was as we twisted and turned to see the bright spots flit around the classroom! I remain thankful for that lesson.

Another early lesson is the story of the great flood and the subsequent rainbow, the sign of God's covenant with Noah and his descendants and every living creature. "God said, "This is the sign of the covenant that I make between me and you and every living creature that is with you, for all future generations: I have set my bow in the clouds, and it shall be a sign of the covenant between me and the earth. When I bring clouds over the earth and the bow is seen in the clouds, I will remember my covenant …" (Genesis 9:12-14 NRSV). Do you remember the first time that you saw a rainbow? Or the last time that you witnessed a rainbow? How did you feel? Perhaps you felt happy and relieved to see the bright colors after the storm; perhaps you wondered where the ends of the rainbow might be or look for a double or triple rainbow; perhaps you felt comforted and safe; perhaps you were thankful for the gift of sight to witness such beauty and to remember God's first covenant.

Rainbows for most of us are rare and wonderful; and it appears that we spend most of our lives in the time between rainbows – in the times of challenges and storms. So how can we cope with the difficult times? David found gratefulness in the hard times and joy in trusting the Lord: "You have put gladness in my heart more than when their grain and wine abound. I will both lie down and sleep in peace; for you alone, O LORD, make me lie down in safety" (Psalm 4:7-8).

As Christians, we are thankful for the assurance that Paul expressed to the Romans, "For I am convinced that neither death, not life, nor angels, nor rulers, nor things present, nor things to come, nor powers, nor height, nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord" (Romans 8:38-39). Finding ways to thank God continually for the blessings in our lives dims our worries and concerns and opens our hearts to accept the hope and joy that abounds in the world. A thankful heart is like the prism releasing all the joyful colors to those around us.

Avenue UMC Council Minutes from

January 23, 2019

PRESENT: Judy Struck, Vaughn Webb, Joyce Voshell, Ed Steiner, Peggy and Larry Hughes, Wendy Butterworth, Tita Lewis, Diane Dolan, Tom Pasmore, Carolyn Humes, Joanne Burbage, Mike Swain, Jim Clendaniel, Bob Berglund, Barbara Rutt, and Bev Bullock.

On Wednesday, January 23, 2019 Judy Struck, chairman of the Church Council, called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. Pastor Tom offered the opening prayer.

Minutes from the last Church Council meeting on October 1, 2018 were reviewed. A motion to approve the amended minutes (name corrections) was made by Larry. The motion was seconded and all approved.

Pastor Tom-- gave a brief overview. He said the SPRC will be meeting on January 31st to discuss the process of the pastoral transition. He is excited about the Discipleship Pathway. With Tom leaving in July, he feels sure that the new pastor will continue with no major changes to the Discipleship Pathway work.

He also said that we have been supporting Kirby Schuler with her missionary work in the past. She is now a missionary coordinator in Ecuador and he would like us to continue supporting her. Peggy motioned for us to continue our current support of \$50/Month (\$600/year) for the next two years. Joanne seconded the motion and all approved.

Pastor Wendy—The Discipleship Pathway Team meets monthly and they have read two books with discussion as to how we want to move forward. We do not know the new pastor yet, but the programs currently in place will continue. We have Sunday school. Vacation Bible School is scheduled for June 24th – 28th and she addressed the need for help and leadership. Sarah Pasmore had been instrumental in that position. Ash Wednesday, Holy Thursday, and Good Friday services are each scheduled for 7 p.m. Easter services will be Sunrise at 6:30 a.m. followed by the usual 8:00, 9:30, and 11:00 a.m. services. Kevin has been involved in the planning.

SPRC: In the absence of Greg Abbott, Pastor Tom reported that the next SPRC meeting will be January 31, 2019 to discuss the transitional process, since Pastor Tom will be leaving in July. They have also been updating the job description and expectations for the evaluations of pastors and church staff for the upcoming year.

DISCIPLESHIP PATHWAY TEAM: The Discipleship Pathway team was held last week and they've decided to discontinue publishing attendance in the MIDWEEK. Increasing numbers does not build disciples. Rather, the team is focusing on what we as a church are and can be doing to move forward in the transformation of the world. Excel Spreadsheets are being developed and the committee wants to determine how this collected data affects decisions within the church and out of the church.

Commission On a Way Forward General Conference is scheduled for February 23rd through February 28th in St. Louis to address three options, and possibly 48 additional options as to how we will move forward with the issues we face with human sexuality.

FINANCIAL REPORTS: Bob Berglund provided print outs of the Avenue UMC Balance Sheet as of December 31, 2018, the Budget vs. Actuals for 2018, and the Budget Overview for Jan. – Dec. 2019 (Attached.) Vaughn motioned to accept the reports. Barbara seconded, and with the vote, all approved.

BOARD OF TRUSTEES: The trustees continue to address building concerns:

- Automating the heating/cooling system control is half done, with thermostats in the pre-school complete.
- The furnishings in the Jo Wood Memorial Lounge are almost complete.
- They are still dealing with the Sanctuary lighting. (Too dim)
- Ten to fifteen years ago, an evaluation of the Bell Tower revealed some concerns with the structural integrity of the tower itself. The same engineering firm may need to reevaluate it at this time, and if repairs are needed, could possibly be in the \$40,000 range.

ENDOWMENT COMMITTEE: An Endowment Committee of seven, chaired by Carolyn Humes has been formed to determine the most effective use for endowments, most recently, that of Jo Wood. They have had their first of three

meetings which was organizational in nature, with much healthy discussion. They hope to have some decisions by mid- February.

DISCUSSION: With the recent Government Shutdown a number of people have been coming to the church for help and support for those affected. Diane Dolan warned that the Food Pantry may feel an influx. So as a church, we need to learn what population is being affected and determine what we can do as a church to support or help those who have been impacted.

The use of the church parking lot by the Food Bank seems to be interfering with the ministries of the church. Tita Lewis agreed to contact them. It was agreed to give them two months to find another location from which they can provide their services.

Another concern-- Jim asked if the "lunch bunch" afternoon pre-school groups that meet on the first floor can be moved to rooms upstairs. Pastor Wendy agreed to address that issue.

Larry announced that a possible mission trip to Florida is currently planned for June 8th through June 16, 2019. Joe Lear and Cliff could contact college students and H.S. seniors who may be interested in assisting with disaster relief projects. The invitation to come back has been extended to us. More info is to follow.

Joanne reported she is still working on the Matthew Project Summary for 2018. She did share that 68 families were served by the Chrismon Tree, 168 families were touched by the Matthew Project throughout the year, and roughly \$11,000 was given to assist with rent, oil, cars, etc. She will have a complete report at the next meeting.

Pastor Wendy is very grateful for how the people of Avenue UMC are truly the hands and feet of **Christ**. She offered the closing prayer and the meeting adjourned at 8:00 p.m. The next meeting is scheduled for May 22, 2019. Additional meetings are on the calendar for Sept. 24th, Dec. 18th, if needed, and Jan. 22, 2020.
