From the desk of our Pastors . . .

Easter is just a few days away. The holiest of all the Christian holidays, the days of Holy Week are not only for recollection, preparation and reconciliation, they are also times of joy and sadness. I would like to share the words that my dear friend Pastor Heidi wrote this month about the glory of the resurrection. For to God belongs the glory forever and ever.

"Alleluia! Christ is Risen!" "He is Risen Indeed! Alleluia!" This Easter greeting is such a joyous exclamation of our faith. I remember singing "Alleluia" in the Cherub Choir. Of course, at five years old, I thought it was great that this song only had one word! As I grew older, the meaning of this one word continues to deepen and expand.

Like the Alleluia song, our Easter greeting goes deeper, it can take us back to the women who followed Jesus from Galilee and their arrival at the tomb on Easter morning. From their grief-stricken eyes, they saw the stone rolled away, the empty tomb, and two men radiantly dressed. Luke tells us, "While they were perplexed about this,...terrified and bowed their faces to the ground,...the men said to them, 'Why do you look for the living among the dead. He is not here, but has risen'" (Luke 24:4-5).

The Gospels tell us how the disciples and others in the group responded to hearing the news of Christ's rising up to defeat death: perplexed, frightened, amazed, slow to believe, forgetful, unrecognizing, and joyful to name a few reactions. I wonder if this time of recognition is also a great moment of stillness, like the psalmist reminds us of when he sings "Be still, and know that I am God" (Psalm 46:10 NRSV). When we are faced with natural disasters, when the world around us feels uncertain, and when God's power and glory are terrifying, we can choose courageously to place our trust and faith in God. Amid the tumult and challenges of our lives, we, too, can pause and find the quiet voice of God above the noise.


The greeting, "Christ is Risen," is not a quote from the Bible, but it summarizes so well our reason for joy. It seems to me that the power of the exclamation is not in the action of rising, but in the present tense of the verb, "To be." When "God said to Moses, 'I AM WHO I AM." ... [And further said]..." Thus you shall say to the Israelites, 'I AM has sent me to you" (Exodus 3:14 NRSV), we begin to understand that God is with us in every "now" moment throughout the entire expanse of our being: the "now" moments of the past, the present and the future, reveal the presence and actions of "I AM." For the women at the empty tomb, "He has risen," is transposed in our time as, "Christ is Risen," using the present tense of the

verb to remind us of our Living Savior with us even now.

In the Gospel of John, Jesus explains, "I am the light of the world; whoever follows me will not walk in darkness but will have the light of life" (John 8:12 NRSV). As we accept "Christ is Risen," we can take the next steps. We can accept also that God is love. "This is love: not that we loved God, but that God loved us and sent his Son as an atoning sacrifice for our sins" (1 John 4:10 NIV). Perhaps, this acceptance of God's love for us is also a part of that great moment of stillness. When we consider God is love, we can stop and accept God's great gift to us at the empty tomb. We can let God's love permeate our beings, and allow us to love one another.

From the desk of the Director of Connectional Ministries

Seeing with Clarity By Rev. Dr. Vicki Gordy-Stith

My husband, Bo, tells a great story about when he played football in high school. At one game late in the season, his team lagged by one point, 16-17. They had possession of the ball with a minute to go. Bo expected the coach to call in a special team to kick a field goal.

Instead, the coach told them to fall on the ball. His team complied. Bo thought to himself, "Oh, the coach really wants to put some pressure on us." For the second down, the coach called the same play—fall on the ball. Bo thought, "Okay, maybe we are running down the clock. But, now he will call in the kicker." When the coach instructed them to fall on the ball for the third down, Bo reminded himself that the coach had years of experience and knew what he was doing. And, on the fourth down, when the coach told them to fall on the ball again, Bo finally thought, "This is bigger than a game. Coach has something else in mind."

When the clock ran down, his teammates began to celebrate. Confused, Bo walked toward the scoreboard. He had not worn his glasses that night and he saw, with joyful dismay, that his team had won, 18-17! He also thanked God that he had not argued and had trusted the coach.

I love that story. It demonstrates a deep trust in the coach to have the best interests of the team at heart. It shows how following the coach's plan pays off, even when you do not understand. And, it reminds us that sometimes others see more clearly than we do.

We, in The United Methodist Church, find ourselves in much the same position as Bo did. We cannot see how the current plan will provide a way to win (in this case, to win disciples for Jesus). We feel confused about the plays being called. We might even feel like we know the answer (call in the kicker) but feel dismayed that our way is not being followed. Instead of trusting the Coach, we find ourselves arguing in the huddle.

Yet, Jesus calls us to a more excellent, if paradoxical, way. Jesus invites us to deny ourselves, to lose our lives, in order to gain them. In other words, to let go. During Lent, many people practice "giving something up" or fasting, which teaches us to let go. To let go of the appetites that control us. To let go of the need to be right. To let go of the need to know everything. To let go of grudges or resentments. To let go of telling God the answer and instead trusting Jesus to lead. To let go of our egos in order to follow Jesus. This letting go requires a deep trust which arises out of a relationship with One whose faithful love never fails. This trust says, "I may not understand your game plan, but I know that you have already won the victory in Jesus."

As we approach Palm/Passion Sunday and walk the final week with Jesus toward the cross, we can practice this letting go in deep trust as a way of experiencing the passion with Jesus. Can you imagine the deep trust he must have had to let go of his very life and trust God would bring him out alive on the other side of the grave? What might God be calling you to let go of in order to deepen your trust in the divine plan? Who might God be calling you to serve in order to experience the humility Jesus demonstrated by washing his disciples' feet? Who is the "Judas" you feel might have betrayed you, but who God is calling you to invite to the table anyway? Where might we be blind to the ways God has already won for us the victory through Jesus? How might God be coaching you towards new life?

And, how might we walk this journey with each other? How might God want to use us to deepen the trust of another? What action might God be calling our churches to take to demonstrate that we can be trusted? How can we live in such a way that people learn to trust each other more, to trust our churches more, and to trust God more? As we work together, may we find ourselves in a holy huddle, encouraging one another to trust the coach, and following the plays that the coach calls. And, may this allow us to experience being "Connected Christians offering the hope of Jesus Christ to today's world."

Why The Fire Matters

Moments Words Don't Reach

The most emotionally powerful song in "Hamilton" comes after the death of Alexander Hamilton's son, Phillip. Angelica sings what any parent who has buried a child knows.

There are moments that the words don't reach. There is suffering too terrible to name.

Yesterday was another of those terrible moments as a largely unbelieving world watched Notre Dame go up in flames.



News commentators struggled to find words to capture both the extent of the destruction and why it matters. The fact that it happened during Holy Week -- a fact that would have otherwise gone unnoticed in a secular culture -- instantly became international news. Faithful Christians who tend to dismiss the importance of church buildings by singing, "the church is not a building/the church is not the steeple/the church is not a resting place/the church is the people" paused and perhaps shed a tear as the spire fell.

Why Cathedrals Matter

Thinking about Notre Dame and church buildings like it, I was drawn back to Phillip Larkin's poem, *Church Going.* (You can hear the poet read it <u>here.</u>) Larkin describes a totally secular, unbelieving man who stops by one of the many empty, aging Anglican churches that are scattered across the English countryside. After walking around and noticing all the accouterments of worship, he wonders,

When churches fall completely out of use What we shall turn them into, if we shall keep A few cathedrals chronically on show...

In the end, he comes to this conclusion:

A serious house on serious earth it is, In whose blent air all our compulsions meet, Are recognized, and robed as destinies. And that much never can be obsolete, Since someone will forever be surprising A hunger in himself to be more serious, And gravitating with it to this ground, Which, he once heard, was proper to grow wise in, If only that so many dead lie round.

One news commentator asked if we are paying so much attention to what we have in the present that we have lost sight of our past. Another wondered if the fire might remind an increasing secular European culture of its Christian history. Another said that the fire drew the world together in a common sense of loss and grief, something that reached beneath the conflicts that divide us.

The experience of watching Notre Dame burn is at least a reminder that places matter. Physical places become sacred spaces because they are the places where we find God -- or more accurately, places where God finds us. Cathedrals like Notre Dame were built to be a visual teaching tool in a largely illiterate culture. They proclaim the gospel without words. Historian Jon Meacham described the cathedral as a "physical manifestation of an unseen reality." He said that one of the most important words in scripture is "remember" and that he shows up at mass whether he feels like it or not in order to remember and experience again the meaning of the death and resurrection of Christ.



Perhaps the image of the Notre Dame cross glowing amid the smoke and ashes will draw us back to the sacred places where we remember and experience the presence of the One who said,

"Unless a grain of wheat falls into the earth and dies, it remains just a single grain; but if it dies, it bears much fruit...And I, when I am lifted up from the earth, will draw all people to myself." (John 12:24-32)
