From the desk of our Pastors . . .

Thank you to everyone who has supplied recipes, best wishes and most importantly prayers as I start my clinical pastoral education class this week. And special thanks to my friend Pastor Heidi for give me the words for this week's Midweek. To God be the glory forever and ever.

How many times have you planted a seed and watched it sprout? It is an amazing thing! How is it that the plant knows when it is moist enough and warm enough that should gather up its strength and burst through the shell, and finding the coolness and darkness, should then reach for the light? I do not know if this still occurs, but many years ago it was a common practice in elementary school to have some duck and chicken eggs in the classroom. How do those little ducklings and chicks know when it is time to start pecking a hole in their shells, and after being in the shell so long, know to get up and start walking around? We have some friends in Hawaii who protect the sea turtle nests until the eggs hatch. How is it that those wee turtles know what to do next? What a wonder it is to witness them race across the sand toward the vast ocean beyond!

As Christians, we too are called to go beyond, and thankfully, are given some general directions. We know that "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your strength, and with all your mind; and your neighbor as yourself" (Luke 10:27). Like the disciples, we are asked to follow Jesus. Like Peter, we are charged with tending and shepherding His sheep; and then feeding them.

A friend recently told me about a couple who when asked what they would do if they suddenly had a million dollars replied, "Oh, just think of all the things we could do for our community." How will we answer the call? Like children, we desire to help in this call to go beyond, and God enables us to do so. An important example of God's lovingkindness in

this regard is related by John when the disciples heard a voice from the shore calling to them and telling them to cast their heretofore empty nets on the other side of the boat. When they reached the shore, they found that Christ had prepared breakfast for them, but allowed Peter to help Him by providing the fish.

Each of us has our own gifts and our own paths. It would seem that God prepares the way for us, and then, allows us to make our own contributions according to our own gifts. When we trust God to lead the way and remember that He is with us always, then we, too, can fearlessly face the beyond. In His farewell, Jesus promises the Comforter, Helper, Teacher, Guide, and Counselor as "the Advocate, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, will teach you everything, and remind you of all that I have said to you. Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled, and do not let them be afraid" (John 14:26-27).

WHY RED?

As we celebrated high holy days of Easter, we enjoyed the beautiful white paraments which symbolize purity, holiness and virtue. Now we move into the season of Pentecost, and change the color of the paraments to red: the color of fire, red symbolizes the presence of God.

The symbols on these beautiful new altar paraments are the dove, which represents the Holy Spirit entwined with the trefoil, a symbol of the Holy Trinity. The Patonce Crosses on each side of center symbols, have expanded ends with three petals on each arm. The three petals represent the Trinity, and the total of twelve petals represent the Apostles.

The center symbol on the pulpit parament, I H S, are the first three letters of the Greek spelling of the Holy Name of Jesus. The symbol on the lectern parament are the descending dove and the Holy Trinity. The symbol on both the bookmarks are Patonce crosses.


