I still remember, as most people do, exactly where I was when I heard about the first plane going into the World Trade Center. I was stuck in traffic at 9:00 am and on my cell phone as part of a daily telecon with members of my team from around the world to do a status update. One of the media managers who walked into the call a few minutes late happened to mention that a plane had flown into one of the towers.

Not having all the data, we assumed it was likely to have been a small tourist plane. While that still would have been horrible, it would not have been on the scale of what the actual event turned out to be. It was not until I got into my office and turned on the television that I saw the footage of the first plane. As the news crew was covering the first crash, it broadcast live the second merely by happenstance. We truly could not believe what we were watching. We thought we were watching a movie of some kind.

In today's world of special effects, nanotechnology and robotics it's easy to understand how some could think it was a show out of Hollywood or fake news. But no matter how much we wanted to believe it was not real, it most certainly was. Even to this day there are people who think that 9/11 truly didn't occur.

It makes me wonder what would happen if Jesus came back today and tried to

get the world to notice Him with His miracles. Would anyone pay attention? How many people would doubt that He was the real deal and not a magician who, with a slight of hand, changed water into wine? Or how many would think that the healing of the lepers was a con of some type where actors were chosen to play lepers and then "conveniently" were healed? How many people, not matter what they saw with their own eyes, would think Jesus was a phony?

God sent His Son for the sake of the world. The Bible, in both the Old and New Testaments tell of His coming and how He will be our source of salvation. Scripture tells us in John 20: 31 that "these are written so that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that by believing you may have life in His name."

We can believe, because to quote from a child's song, "for the Bible tells us so." What an amazing God we serve who gave us His only Son as the Messiah.

Let us take some time today to remember all those who were lost on this day 18 years ago and to lift before the Lord their families and friends who still mourn their loss. For to God be the glory forever and ever.
