From the desk of our Pastors . . .

My son Chris recently had a concern related to his car. It wasn't a major problem but the end result was that he had to get his battery replaced. The issue was that his old battery died for good on a Friday evening when he was about 30 minutes away from home. AAA jumped it but when it didn't hold the charge, Chris had to get it towed to a nearby service station that replaced the battery the following morning. But that meant that Chris had to get a ride home that night. Thankfully Uber came to the rescue.

Chris was really bummed. This little setback had ruined his plans for the evening, cost him money he didn't want to spend, and left him without the security of a vehicle in the event he would actually need it.

But when he called me later to tell me he had gotten home okay, he was in a remarkably good mood. His reason was that the Uber driver had been "really great." The guy who picked him up had been sympathetic, supportive, understanding, and kind. He made Chris feel better about the whole situation.

A complete stranger took the time to listen, commiserate and empathize with my son and it made all the difference to Chris that night. As a mother, I am very grateful for what this driver did for my child and I pray that he will also be given grace and understanding when he needs it.


Everyone has those times when we need to rely on a stranger for some reason. Blanche DuBois, in the movie "A Streetcar Named Desire" made famous the line, "I have always depended on the kindness of strangers" and it's true.

But there will also be those times when we ARE those strangers that someone will need to

rely on. Are we ready and willing to be kind, compassionate and understanding in order to care for someone who needs us to make their world better, even if it's only for a half hour on a Friday night?

Scripture is very clear that we need to be the stranger that others can rely on in times of need. Leviticus 25: 35 tells us, "If your brother becomes poor and cannot maintain himself with you, you shall support him as though he were a stranger and a sojourner." In Hebrews 13:2, "Do not neglect to show hospitality to strangers for thereby some have entertained angels unawares."

Is it a cold or the flu?

SYMPTOMS	COLD	FLU	
Fever	Rare	Usual; high (100° F to 102° F, occasionally higher, especially in young children); lasts 3 to 4 days	
Headache	Rare	Common	
General Aches, Pains	Slight	Usual; often severe	
Fatigue, Weakness	Sometimes	Usual: can last up to 2 to 3 weeks	
Extreme Exhaustion	Never	Usual; at the beginning of the illness	
Stuffy Nose	Common	Sometimes	
Sneezing	Usual	Sometimes	
Sore Throat	Common	Sometimes	
Chest Discomfort, Cough	Mild to Moderate: hacking cough	Common; can become severe	

Most people with flu have mild illness and do not need medical care or antiviral drugs. If you get sick with flu symptoms, in most cases, you should stay home and avoid contact with other people except to get medical care. If, however, you have symptoms of flu and are at high risk of flu complications, or are very sick or concerned about your illness, contact your health care provider.

Brochures contain pertinent information along with gender and age related labels to adhere to the box, and an envelope for a \$9 shipping fee (explanation below).

For groups of people who are filling multiple boxes as a project, make sure that each box includes a \$9 shipping fee and that you grab enough brochures for labels. To make it easier, total your number of boxes, multiply by \$9 and fill out.....ONE Check-in ONE Envelope-in ONE Box.

If you have any questions you can ask at the table or call Carole Brennan at 302-858-2065. **Note that our church is** purchasing these boxes for us; thus we ask that you use what you take.

Information to start thinking about

Find a Shoebox

Start with an <u>average-size</u> cardboard or plastic shoebox. If you want to wrap it, cover the box and lid SEPARATLY. OR, use a church-provided box found in the foyer on the dates above -- these are <u>not</u> to be wrapped.

Girls or Boys?

Decide whether you will pack a box for a girl or a boy, and the age category: 2–4, 5–9, or 10–14. The brochure contains labels for the gender and age of a child. Cut out your choice, check the age group and adhere to the top of the box.

Fill with Gifts

Select a medium to large "wow" item such as a soccer ball with pump or stuffed animal or doll, then fill with other fun toys, hygiene items, and school supplies. (We will provide you with a list of gift ideas.) Local Dollar Stores are a great place to start. Remember, no liquids, toothpaste, gum, candy, used or damaged items, war-related items, seeds, food, liquids or lotions, medications, vitamins, breakable items, glass containers, aerosol cans, or anything that can melt in hot climates.

Pray

Most importantly, pray for the child who will receive your gift. You can also include a personal note and photo.

All boxes must include \$9

After filling your box, make out your check payable to Samaritan's Purse, then complete the front of the envelope found in your brochure (you can use Avenue United Methodist Church, 20 N. Church St., Milford, DE 19963 instead of your own personal information) -- place inside the box. Your \$9 helps with shipping to over 100 countries where millions of shoeboxes are distributed. Your donation also provides *The Greatest Gift Gospel* booklets, which are written in the children's language and distributed along with shoebox gifts.

If you make this donation online, you can *Follow Your Box* and receive a special label. Attach the label to your shoebox, and use the *Look-up Tool* to find out the country where your box will be delivered with the message of Christ's love.
