From the desk of our Pastors . . .

As you are reading this, (if you read it sometime the week of October 7), I am in Alaska for a drill with BP Shipping. I flew out on Monday and will be back on Friday, but in between my team and I will be putting a group of about 400 people through the nightmare of a simulated oil spill off the coast of Valdez.

Federal law mandates oil companies do these types of major drills on a regular basis in order to operate. So for a few days every year, I take part in an exercise where my job is to make everyone's lives as miserable as possible. Together with the rest of the "Pita Team" we become the worldwide media, elected officials from all levels of government, disgruntled former employees, concerned citizens, irate environmentalists, children concerned about wildlife, and everyone else we have thought of who may be impacted by an actual spill. We take on those personas and "throw" at the incident response team all of the problems we come up with. It takes months of planning by the exercise creators.

Over the course of the drill, I will be 100 different people and I am just one of seven doing the role playing. We then grade the public information officers and liaison teams and decide if they pass or fail. There are additional evaluators who are watching and grading other departments including operations, health and safety, logistics, finance, human resources, and every other agency and organization that is involved with the incident. It is our hope that by getting ready before the actual incident takes place, the responding team will be better prepared to deal with the reality of the situation.

BP takes this very seriously and they spend lots of money to make sure it is done properly. It's not just a bunch of people sitting around a room "pretending" to respond. The helicopters get flown, the ships with the needed equipment and personnel are launched, the press releases are written, the created television news segments are broadcast on an internal channel, the phone numbers to report oiled wildlife or make a financial claim are activated, and the list goes on and on.

And it's not just BP that is part of the drill. In the case of an actual emergency, the Coast Guard, EPA, Federal Department of Fish and Wildlife, the State of Alaska, the tanker companies, local first responders, Forest Service, native American tribal leaders, and a plethora of other groups would be part of the real thing. So they also are part of the exercise. Nobody or any agency is spared.

The ramifications of a real spill are endless. You just have to think back to the Deepwater Horizon disaster to recognize the nightmare impact. If you remember the Exxon Valdez accident you will understand why we do what we do.

So we drill and train and learn from our successes and mistakes and then we drill and train some more. And we keep drilling and training so that when it happens, we will be ready. We need to be as prepared as possible because we all know it's not a question of "if" but "when" the next spill will occur.

If you have ever been part of a military drill, you know how this works. There are plenty of other industries, government agencies, and organizations that do similar activities.

But it makes me stop and think...why don't we do the same to get ready for the return of Christ? Why don't we take the time to prepare and learn and make our life experience about waiting for God to come back? Because we also know that His return is not a question of if but when. We have been promised by the Lord that He will come again. It's a sure thing. So why don't we take it seriously and plan and get ready for the return of our Savior? If Jesus came back today, would we be ready?

There is a lot of scripture that talks about being prepared for the return of Jesus. Revelation 16:15 says, "Behold, I am coming like a thief. Blessed is the one who stays awake, keeping his garments on, that he may not go about naked and be seen exposed." Matthew 24:43 reminds us, "But know this, that if the master of the house had known in what part of the night the thief was coming, he would have stayed awake and would not have let his house be broken into." 1 Thessalonians 5:2 and 4 states, "For you yourselves are fully aware that the day of the Lord will come like a thief in the night. But you are not in darkness, brothers and sisters, for that day to surprise you like a thief." And 2 Peter 3:10 tells us, "But the day of the Lord will come like a thief, and then the heavens will pass away with a roar, and the heavenly bodies will be burned up and dissolved, and the earth and the works that are done on it will be exposed."

Yes, an oil spill would be a horrible thing but that is nothing compared to not being ready for Christ's return to the world. That would be the worst thing that could ever happen to us. We don't want to be unprepared and there is no reason we should be. We have the ability to learn from those who came before us – the disciples and apostles. Thankfully they have shared their wisdom and knowledge with us through their teaching and writings. We have an entire book that gives us direction and guidance. The Bible includes the very words of Jesus himself. We are in fellowship with all Christian believers, and while we don't always agree on the way we should go, we do recognize Jesus as Savior and acknowledge He is coming again. In that way we are all in this together. There is no reason why we should not be fully and completely ready for the return of our Lord and Savior and yet, we fail to prepare because we think it could never happen in our lifetimes. Are we so sure? Would it not be better to be ready then to be surprised should it occur? After all, it's not a question of "if" we will see Him, it's only a matter of "when." Our lives should be focused on preparing for that glorious moment.

For to God belongs the glory and honor forever and ever.
