A few weeks ago there was a story on the news about Qantas Airlines getting ready to begin non-stop service from New York to Sydney, Australia. Flying time was approximately 19 hours. I love to travel but 19 straight hours on a plane sounds miserable to me.

The story explained how the shake down flights underway included calisthenics led by the flight attendants, two crews who took shifts sleeping in their private quarters, and the effort to do all things (such as eat and sleep) on Sydney time.

The specially configured aircraft has more business- and first-class seats for sleeping, an expanded entertainment system, and a broader menu of food and beverage items that the journalist traveling onboard reported were quite tasty. Maybe there is no scenery at all, just the sense of peace and calm that makes you want to be in that state of comfort and never move.

One thing, however, is for sure. I am certain I have no idea what heaven will really be like. Our imagination is not capable of thinking of how incredible it will be. 1 Corinthians 2:9 says this about heaven. "But as it is written, what no eye has seen, nor ear heard, nor the heart of man imagined, what God has prepared for those who love him."

Life on earth is wonderful in many ways and none of us need to be in a hurry to get to heaven. But when the Lord calls us to our rightful inheritance in His kingdom, we can be assured it will be an eternity worth the wait. Until then, let us work to bring Him honor and glory here on earth.
