The Midweek

Wednesday, May 6, 2020

As always, my friend Pastor Heidi provided her very beautiful thoughts to me and I'd like to share them with you. And to God be the glory forever and ever.

What a vital time it is for us to lean on the infinite capacity of the Holy Spirit to comfort and to teach us. We might ask ourselves, what did Jesus do when He knew that difficult times were coming? In anticipation of the crucifixion and the unsettling times that would follow, Jesus gathered the disciples for one of the most comforting discussions. He prepared them for His death, resurrection and ascension, and the coming of the Holy Spirit. He gave them, and He gives us in these troubling times, a message of great hope, of love demonstrated by obedience, and of trust as evidenced through prayer.

Even now, He comforts by saying: "Do not let your hearts be troubled. Believe in God, believe also in Me...you know the way to the place where I am going...[For] I am the way, and the truth, and the life...If you love Me, you will keep My commandments...[Through prayer] I will do whatever you ask in My name, so that the Father may be glorified in the Son. If in My name you ask Me for anything, I will do it... And I will ask the Father, and He will give you another Advocate to be with you forever. This is the Spirit of truth...You know Him because He abides with you, and He will be in you...the Advocate, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in My name, will teach you everything, and remind you of all that I have said to you" (John 14:1-27).

We can ask, what gifts will be revealed through these challenging times? We can find great comfort in listening for the Holy Spirit's lessons and reminders.

Indeed, Isaiah prophesized that we will be strong in the Lord so that we might soar on wings like eagles and run without tiring in the easy times and more importantly, when times are hard, we might still walk (Isaiah 40:31).

These times for humankind are very different. We are used to running and soaring, working, traveling, going to school, going to church, being physically near each other, and being relatively healthy. In these times, some of us are stretched to the maximum with long hours and emotionally draining work. Others of us suddenly struggle to walk, to be still, to be healthy by staying at home unless our work is essential to the new normal.

As we learn this different way of living, Jesus' words take on new meanings. As Christians, we are challenged to keep His commandments in new ways. How can we comfort and love one another while staying at home and social distancing? How can we be more creative in our kindness? How can we be grateful for what this turmoil may bring? In both this new chaos and stillness, we certainly can pray to be open to God's will and to accept that God knows what we need.

Mother Theresa wrote, "The first requirement of prayer is silence...Prayer is putting oneself in the hands of God, at His disposition, and listening to His voice in the depths of our hearts." As we pray, we all become essential workers, and as such we are led to do God's work with loving kindness in new ways. Mother Theresa also said that "Holiness does not consist in doing extraordinary things. It consists in accepting, with a smile what Jesus sends us. It consists in accepting and following the will of God...God has created us so we do small things with great love" so that through us, this great love extends throughout the world.

As Jesus concludes His comforting discussion with the disciples, He also delivers the message of His peace and joy. "Peace I leave with you; My peace I give to you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled, and do not let them be afraid. If you loved Me, you would rejoice that I am going to the Father, because the Father is greater than I...I do as the Father has commanded Me, so that the world may know that I love the Father" (John 14:28-31). We too may take comfort and courage in His words and find His peace and the joy of His love of the Father.

GENERAL CONFERENCE POSTPONED - With the spread of the Coronavirus worldwide, The 2020 General Conference, scheduled for May 5th-15th in Minneapolis, MN, has been postponed until 2021. General Conference is attended by over 800 delegates and Bishops from four continents. This decision comes at a time where our denomination was facing questions about a possible split as well as other major decisions around budget reductions and new elected leaders. The body of the General Conference is the only body that can set church doctrine and polity. The Discipline (our church doctrine and polity) set at the called Special General Conference of 2019 is the current church law within The United Methodist Church.

As of this time, there are no new dates for General Conference 2021. As part of The United Methodist Church, we continue to pray for our Bishops, leaders, and delegates who guide our denomination and churches.

Bayhealth Expands Community Coronavirus Testing in Sussex County

Bayhealth is partnering with the Governor's office, the Division of Public Health, and our other healthcare systems to expand Coronavirus community testing and outreach to high-risk populations in Sussex County. No appointment is necessary.

Bayhealth will provide walk-up or drive-up community testing at the **DHSS State Services Center in Milford located at 253 NE Front Street from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m.** on these dates: May 7, May 9, and May 11.

This expanded community testing is geared to the following high-risk populations: those with symptoms consistent with COVID-19, those living or working with someone diagnosed with COVID-19, family members or housemates of those working in the poultry industry, and those with chronic medical conditions such as asthma, diabetes, hypertension, or compromised immune systems.

Coronavirus testing is available for all ages. Nemours AI DuPont will be available to provide pediatric patient testing.

Delawareans with questions about COVID-19, related to medical or social service needs, should call 2-1-1; or 7-1-1 for individuals who are deaf or hard-of-hearing. Hours of operation are 8 a.m. to 9 p.m., Monday through Friday; and 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. on the weekends. You may also email DPHCall@delaware.gov with questions.

A Room of My Own

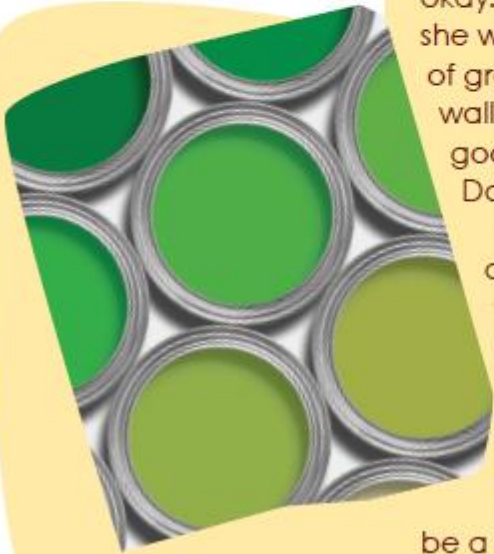
