GENERAL CONFERENCE POSTPONED - With the spread of the Coronavirus worldwide, The 2020 General Conference, scheduled for May 5th-15th in Minneapolis, MN, has been postponed until 2021. General Conference is attended by over 800 delegates and Bishops from four continents. This decision comes at a time where our denomination was facing questions about a possible split as well as other major decisions around budget reductions and new elected leaders. The body of the General Conference is the only body that can set church doctrine and polity. The Discipline (our church doctrine and polity) set at the called Special General Conference of 2019 is the current church law within The United Methodist Church.

As of this time, there are no new dates for General Conference 2021. As part of The United Methodist Church, we continue to pray for our Bishops, leaders, and delegates who guide our denomination and churches.

We will start by having Janice share her witness from 1984. It is still as pertinent today as it was more than 25 years ago.

From Janice Abbott:

I will start with Jim's and my witness dated 1984. Our faith in God was severely tested in March of that year. Back then, Joanne Burbage asked me to share a Witness to Our Faith. She recently gave me a copy which I will include in this article. It is now 2020 and it seems, as I age, that my faith is tested frequently. However God, my faithful friend, has helped me through each day and whatever crisis or problem I may face. I always say, "I can do all things through Jesus Christ who strengthens me," (Phil 4:13) when my faith is tested. I don't always understand why things happen in our lives, but I do know God is always there for us to lessen the pain and heartbreak and to give us hope.

When I was asked to write some thoughts for the Ave-News on my faith, I said yes, immediately. I felt it would be easy for me. However, my friends, it was not easy. Life is not always easy, just as it is not always easy to be a Christian. Jim and I have struggled daily since our daughter's death on March 9, 1984. Thanks be to God we now walk with inner peace and blessed assurance that Vonda Kay is with Him.

The day of the accident our dear minister, Frank Lucia said, "Absent from the body, present with the Lord." We did not have a doubt that Vonda was immediately with God. For the believer, death means entering into the glorious presence of Christ. However, when a young and beautiful life is suddenly, in the wink of an eye, taken from you, how do you accept it? You believe! You believe in God's promise to you.

Jesus said, "I am the resurrection and the life. Whoever believes in me will live, even though he dies, and whoever lives and believes in me will never die. Do you believe this?" (John 11:25-26)

We believe this and our faith gets us through each day. The real victory of faith is to trust God in the dark and through the dark. We are safer with Him in the dark than without Him in the sunshine.

The simplest faith is one that asks no questions. It is very difficult. We always want to know "why?" Why did this tragic thing happen to us? We believe in God as our Father

and we trust Him. We know He had a plan for Vonda. That is why He made her so special when she was here on earth. We feel we experienced more love from her in 18 years than most people find in a lifetime. Her death made us realize what is really important in life. Look around you each day and see what God gives you so freely, such as your health, your precious loved ones, the sky, sun, flowers, birds, trees, sunshine, rain, etc.

We take all these things in faith, however, we tend to take them for granted. Thank God many people in life do realize how precious these things are. They can be taken away so quickly. We know that Vonda has entered a sweeter, deeper joy and her life is even fuller now with Christ. She is being kept safe and secure for us in the home of God.

We really have not lost her, she has just been taken from our sight. She will have grown into rarer beauty and greater dearness when we meet her again. God knows best and we will see the reason clearly some day when we see our angel again.

"God is our refuge and strength, a very present help in trouble." (Psalm 46:1) Memories flood our mind every day. We have so many beautiful ones of her. Have faith, our special friends, and build special memories everyday with your loved ones.

"Trust in Him at all times; ye people, pour out your heart before Him. God is a refuge for us." (Psalm 62:8)





Promises, Promises


