Morning by morning he wakens – wakens my ears and heart to listen. Isaiah 50:4. God also reminds us that our prayers are a two-way communication and that we are to keep our hearts and mind open to what our Heavenly Father has to say to us. Our ears are connected to our hearts and when God awakens one, the other is opened also. Let us remember to keep in mind that with open ears and hearts, we can always hear and feel God beside us and that our ears and hearts will always be filled with the wisdom and goodness of our Heavenly Father.

I go to God in prayer daily and through the years I have found my life has become so much richer and wiser by listening to what God is saying to me. There is a healing in the power of prayer. Now let me back up for a moment and fill you into where all this began.

I was born in Dover, Delaware in 1946. I was baptized when I was an infant. I attended Delaware schools until 7<sup>th</sup> grade, at which time family moved to West Chester, PA. I was confirmed at age 12 and joined our Walther League Christian group, until I graduated from High School and left for college. My parents and family were always strong believers in our faith, and I continued to remain strong even during my college years.

One Mother's Day, I called home to wish my Mother, Happy Mother's Day and she broke down in tears. I knew after the conversation we had, I needed to return home. I could put my college on hold until a further date. My Father had been diagnosed with terminal bone cancer and we knew our time was precious at this point. I lost my Dad in 1983 at the age of 61, Needless to say, the healing power of prayer comforted both my Mother and myself in the months ahead. As Jesus has promised us, "That He will never leave us or forsake us." It is believed that all healing is divine and that having a good attitude and spirit are essential for good health. Prayer heals because it links us with God who created us, and this also helped us through the death of my Mother and Brother in 1997.

In 1989 I met my husband Terry at a private dinner party just a couple of blocks over from where my Mother's beach house was and began dating. Terry and I seem to hit it off right away, and were married May 4, 1991, and have been richly blessed ever since. Now for one of the highlights of our lives is when Terry and I were asked by his sister if we were interested in doing the Emmaus Walk down in the Shenandoah Valley at Camp Overlook, Virginia. Talk about a mountain top experience. There are no words to describe it. I will never forget the 3<sup>rd</sup> day after prayer in the chapel when I was walking up the hill to come in for the night, I looked up in the sky and saw the moon shining so brightly it was breathtaking and I have never seen it shine like that since. I could not hold back all the tears that began to flow down my cheeks, just thinking about our Lord and Savior who died on the Cross, shed his blood for you and me for us to have eternal life and live with Him forever. I was in awe for the remaining time there. So for anyone who wants to enjoy a mountain moving experience, please see me, I promise you will not be disappointed for sure.

And now if you will allow me, a few moments on prayer, the healing power of prayer. By putting God 1<sup>st</sup> in our lives we begin having a loving relationship like none other. Prayer helps us achieve health and wholeness spiritually, physically and mentally. Meditation is often self-centered. But prayer is God centered. Prayer originates in a relationship with God. The more we pray, the deeper that relationship grows. Prayer is an innate human experience. Prayer is conversation, open your heart to God and you will be amazed at what He has to say to you. Always remember that through God," all things are possible", and " just ask and ye shall receive". To God be the Glory.

### Tips for social distancing

- Follow guidance from authorities
- If you need to shop for food or medicine at the grocery store or pharmacy, stay at least 6 feet away from others. Also consider other options:
  - Use mail-order for medications, if possible.
  - Consider a grocery delivery service.
- Cover your mouth and nose with a <u>cloth face covering</u> when around others, including when you have to go out in public, for example to the grocery store.
  - Cloth face coverings should NOT be placed on children under age 2, anyone who has trouble breathing, or is unconscious, incapacitated, or otherwise unable to remove the mask without assistance. https://www.cdc.gov/coronavirus/2019-ncov/images/face-covering-checklist.jpg
  - Keep at least 6 feet between yourself and others, even when you wear a face covering.
- Avoid gatherings of any size outside your household, such as a friend's house, parks, restaurants, shops, or any other place. This advice applies to people of any age, including teens and younger adults. Children should not have in-person playdates while school is out. To help maintain social connections while social distancing, learn tips to keep children healthy while school's out.
- Work from home when possible.
