How should Christians approach an election, whether it is in the church, our state, or our nation? It's a great question to ask and one that the Bible does not address specifically. John Wesley, the founder of the Methodist movement, address voting in a letter written on October 6, 1777. He wrote,

"I met with those in our society who had votes in the ensuing election and advised them,

- 1. To vote, without fee or reward, for the person they judged most worthy.
- 2. To speak no evil of the person they voted against: And
- 3. To take care that their spirits were not sharpened against those that voted on the other side."

You could boil down Wesley's advice to this: Don't sell your vote. Don't speak evil of your opponents. Be generous towards those who disagree with you.

This is a great application of Jesus' teaching to "love your enemies" (Matthew 5:44). It is easy to love those who look, think, believe and speak the same way as we do. We are growing in our faith as Jesus' apprentices when we are able to love those who are different from us. This does not remove the ability to hold conversations or spirited debates, but Wesley reminds us of how we are to live with those who believe differently than us.

I am alarmed at how polarized our society has become. We have lost the ability

to love those we disagree with. The Church must lead the way. The Church is a practice lab for us to love our brothers and sisters in Christ who think and believe differently than us. If we cannot do that within the Church, how can we do that in the world?

As November 3<sup>rd</sup> draws closer, let us commit to embodying Wesley's advice: Don't see your vote. Don't speak evil of your opponents. Be generous towards those who disagree with you. Let us reflect the light and love of Christ in the Church, in our homes, and in our community.

I remember going to Avenue as a little girl with my grandmother Willis, we would go to Sunday School and then on the church service. I remember kneeling on the floor and writing on a piece of paper during the service. Once I was in school than I stayed in the nursery and helped. When in middle school, we had a teach by the name of Mr. Dallas Hitchens that taught us all about the Bible and started us on our journey of faith. I learned a lot from Mr. Hitchens and to this day still remember all the important things he taught us. As middle schooler we all joined the church (that was 65 years ago). My faith has grown stronger over the years and I try to live the way God has taught us through the Bible. Similarities:

**Both COVID-19 and flu** can have varying degrees of signs and symptoms, ranging from no symptoms (asymptomatic) to severe symptoms. Common symptoms that COVID-19 and flu share include:

- Fever or feeling feverish/chills
- Cough
- Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
- Fatigue (tiredness)
- Sore throat
- Runny or stuffy nose
- Muscle pain or body aches
- Headache

### Flu Symptoms

Influenza (flu) can cause mild to severe illness, and at times can lead to death. Flu is different from a cold. Flu usually comes on suddenly. People who have flu often feel some or all of these symptoms:

- · fever\* or feeling feverish/chills
- cough
- sore throat
- runny or stuffy nose
- muscle or body aches
- headaches
- fatigue (tiredness)
- some people may have vomiting and diarrhea, though this is more common in children than adults.
  \*It's important to note that not everyone with flu will have a fever.\*

**People with COVID-19** have had a wide range of symptoms reported – ranging from mild symptoms to severe illness. Symptoms may appear **2-14 days after exposure to the virus.** People with these symptoms may have COVID-19:

- Fever or chills
- Cough
- Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
- Fatigue
- Muscle or body aches
- Headache
- New loss of taste or smell
- Sore throat
- Congestion or runny nose
- Nausea or vomiting
- Diarrhea .
