
We continue to move into a new season of ministry at Avenue Church. We are looking at

PLEASE MAKE YOUR WORSHIP RESERVATION: As we continue to adapt our worship services to meet the State guidelines and best practices in the midst of a pandemic, **we are asking each person/family planning on attending worship to make a reservation.**

On Thursday afternoon we will be sending out an email with the reservation link.

I received a call from my dear friend, Janice Abbott, who shared with me her newest ministry – encouraging others to witness their faith – and she asked that I share mine in the AveNews. How wonderful to see God using Janice in such an uplifting way. Through her guidance and encouragement, our brothers and sisters in Christ are stepping out in faith to share their testimonies, and those of us who read their messages are blessed.

I am fortunate to have grown up in a home with loving parents who instilled in me godly principles and moral. I cannot remember a day when I did not love the Lord. When I was a young adult, however, I realized there is much more to one's Christian faith than just loving the Lord. I learned from others that God longs and seeks a relationship with us. That is something I could not confidently say I had. Before I could have a relationship with God, I would need to know Him personally and intimately by spending time in His word which, up to that time, I had not done. Relationships require time and commitment. Reading and studying the Bible had not been on my top priority list.

When I became a mother, my most important responsibility was to give my sons a firm foundation by teaching them about God and His love for them. However, without a better knowledge of God's Word, I knew I would have difficulty giving them proper instruction. It was then that God intervened in my life. I was asked to teach a children's Sunday school class. Although I felt quite unprepared, our Sunday school superintendent confidently encouraged me and told me not to worry, I would learn with the children. Surprisingly, that's exactly what happened. As I learned, the desire to know more grew even stronger. A spark was ignited in my heart to seek Him more fully. It was 1994 when I enrolled in my first adult Bible study class and my life-long adventure in relationship with

God began. As I continued to teach Sunday school and attend Bible study classes, my knowledge and relationship with God grew. However, God taught me that what I was learning was not for me alone. Jesus commands us to make disciples of all nations. We are all called to witness and share with others what we have learned as we study Scripture and to use the gifts God gives us to bless others.

As my knowledge and faith broadened, God ever-so-gently molded me into a new person in Christ. From 2001 to 2011, God encouraged me to reach out to my sisters in faith by organizing biennial bus trips to Philadelphia to attend Women of Faith conferences. Sounds simple, but God in his loving and compassionate way used this unique opportunity to reveal Himself to every person attending those conferences. Not only did we receive Biblical teaching from the conference speakers, but God touched our hearts and rejuvenated our souls as we set aside time to be in His presence.

In 2005, God opened yet another door of opportunity to me. Instead of simply attending Bible studies, I was asked to facilitate one. Once again, my insecurities arose but God showed me that facilitators are not expected to know all the answers. All that was needed was a teachable heart. Facilitating that one class led to another, and another, and another. Throughout the years, God has transformed me from a timid, uneducated, and weak Christian to one who is no longer afraid to share the Good News of Jesus with others.

I retired my Sunday school teaching adventure after 20 incredible years. While I planned to continue attending and facilitating Bible studies, I had no immediate plan to change how I would serve God in the future. It was then that God called me to my greatest challenge. He placed on my heart the need to reach out to those who were hurting from the loss of a loved one. The GriefShare ministry began in 2008 and ran until 2016. To this day, I do not know why God chose me for this ministry but I can assure you, it was the greatest privilege of my life. With the assistance of Janice Abbott, Ann and Terry Andrews, Carlton Goodhand, Tita Lewis, and Diana Barnard, we faithfully followed God's call by sharing with so many the love, guidance, comfort, and peace that only God can give to those who are facing the most difficult journey of their lives. God's promises are real. He is faithful and true. He will never leave or abandon you. His love and mercy endure forever.

God works in mysterious ways. We do not always know His plan or understand it. But one thing's for sure—God's plan is perfect. After more than forty wonderful years at Avenue, God called Larry and me to step out in faith and follow His calling. While we no longer attend Avenue Church, God has truly blessed us with

new opportunities to serve Him. We continue to study God's word. I assist in a ministry that reaches out to those in need. God has truly blessed us. My desire is to be as faithful to God as He has been to me. We may not be called to remain in any one ministry forever but instead He asks us to be faithful and obedient to Him and to love and trust Him with all your heart, soul, mind, and strength. That is my goal – to be faithful and obedient to His calling in His perfect timing.

OCCUPATIONAL THERAPY

PASSION. PURPOSE. POSSIBILITY.



What is Occupational Therapy?

Occupational therapy is the only profession that helps people across the lifespan to do the things they want and need to do through the therapeutic use of daily activities (occupations). Occupational therapy practitioners enable people of all ages to live life to its fullest by helping them promote health, and prevent—or live better with—injury, illness, or disability.

Common occupational therapy interventions include helping children with disabilities to participate fully in school and social situations, helping people recovering from injury to regain skills, and providing supports for older adults experiencing physical and cognitive changes.

Occupational therapy services typically include:

- an individualized evaluation, during which the client/family and occupational therapist determine the person’s goals,
- customized intervention to improve the person’s ability to perform daily activities and reach the goals, and
- an outcomes evaluation to ensure that the goals are being met and/or make changes to the intervention plan.

Occupational therapy practitioners have a holistic perspective, in which the focus is on adapting the environment and/or task to fit the person, and the person is an integral part of the therapy team. It is an evidence-based practice deeply rooted in science.
