Lamenting With the World

Over the last few weeks, I have been overwhelmed by the images coming out of Haiti and Afghanistan. Haiti is not only an impoverished nation, they continue to be the victim of devastating earthquakes and the assassination of their President earlier this summer. The aftermath of The United States' military exit of Afghanistan has raised questions about the mechanics of such a move and what will happen to the people of that nation as the Taliban takes control of the control.

I don't claim any geopolitical knowledge. I'm not a foreign policy expert. I don't know why Haiti's President was assassinated or any answers to 20 years of involvement by America in Afghanistan. What I recognize is the need for lament when we view the brokenness in our world.

Lament is an expression of loss. Lament is when the Psalmist express their grief over the brokenness and sin he sees in the world. Lament is Jeremiah writing about the devastation the people experienced as they are overrun by an invading army. The Biblical writers cried out and turned to God through their times of lament.

In the Western Christian Church we do not lament very well. We would prefer prayers, hymns, and postures of worship that leave us feeling "good" after worship. Lament invites us to sit with the pain and misery that others experience. I believe that for the Church to engage in fruitful ministry that it must learn once again how to lament. We must, as Paul writes in Romans 12:15, to "*rejoice with those who rejoice, and mourn with those who mourn.*"

I don't have the answers and my opinion is not always helpful. What I can do, as a

Christian, is to empathize with the pain and experience of others. We should lament the grave danger that women, children, and Christians face in Afghanistan. We should lament the poverty we see in Haiti. We should mourn with the families of George Floyd and Breonna Taylor for their tragic deaths. We should share the ministry of presence with families in our own community who are experiencing suffering. We don't need the answers. We don't need to know all the political implications. We just need to lament when we see other human beings suffer, and to take our prayers to God who hears and who cares.

In the midst of lament, we can see glimpses of goodness and of the Kingdom of God. In places like Haiti, people of all walks of life are working together to clear rubble and to serve their neighbors. In Afghanistan, there are incredible pictures of our service men and women caring for babies and children in the midst of a terrible situation. As we cry out to God in lament, let us never stop looking for and working towards God's Kingdom on the earth.

Mask Are Recommended, But Not [Yet] Required

As our attendance numbers continue to increase and we head into the Fall, it is a good time to remind everyone of Avenue's COVID protocols. We want to remain vigilant and continue to create space that is safe and welcoming. Other than two Sundays, Avenue has been able to remain open for worship since July 2020. To continue, we need everyone to show care and concern for one another by putting others ahead of our own preferences.

We continue to ask that unvaccinated persons wear masks while in the building. This is one of the best way (along with social distancing) to mitigate the spread of COVID-19. Children, over the age of 2, who have not been vaccinated should also wear a mask while in worship.

An important part of our church family is the ability to hug, shake hands, and experiences positive physical touch. There is something healing about a hug. As we've learned in the last 16 months is that there is also a risk to physical touch. Please continue to practice social distancing as best as possible. The CDC recommends 3 feet of distance between households and people. Avenue continues to provide hand sanitizer throughout the building to help reduce the spread of germs.

We love seeing each of you on Sunday mornings. Let us continue to do our part to make it possible for us to come together in-person for worship. Let us not grow weary of doing good and caring for our neighbors around us.


