Waffle House Church

I love the convenience and the food at Waffle House. The hash browns are my favorite. I like getting my hash browns "scattered, smothered, and covered." If you're not a Waffle House aficionado, I will explain. "Scattered" is the potato covering your plate, "smothered" with onions, and "covered" in cheese. Waffle House hash browns may be a great example of how Christians are to live. We are to be "gathered, covered, and scattered." For centuries, Christians have gathered to worship God and to encourage one another in fellowship. On the first day of the week, Resurrection Day, we come together to proclaim the truth that Jesus is the Son of God, has risen from the dead, and the hope that we, too, will experience resurrection. In the Cross of Christ, the blood of Jesus covers us. We are not covered, but Jesus' death covers and forgives our sins and makes us a new creation. Being covered means we no longer belong to the world but Jesus. Finally, our ministry and mission scatter us out from the church. We are dispersed to our neighbors, co-workers, and family to share the Good News about Jesus' life, death, and resurrection. God calls each of us into ministry to our neighbors and the world.

This Sunday, we will gather together for our Fall Kick-Off at 10:00 a.m. It will be a time of worship and celebration for our entire church family. It has been two

years since we have been able to gather like this. We will worship God who covers our sin through Jesus' work on the cross. We will be scattered from the Church to Milford, Lincoln, Ellendale, Harrington, Houston, Frederica, Camden-Wyoming, and many other places in our community to live as the hands and feet of Christ. I hope you will make plans to join us as we begin this new season of ministry at Avenue.

As our attendance numbers continue to increase and we head into the Fall, it is a good time to remind everyone of Avenue's COVID protocols. We continue to ask that unvaccinated persons wear masks while in the building. This is one of the best way (along with social distancing) to mitigate the spread of COVID-19. Children, over the age of 2, who have not been vaccinated should also wear a mask while in worship.

An important part of our church family is the ability to hug, shake hands, and experiences positive physical touch. There is something healing about a hug. As we've learned in the last 16 months is that there is also a risk to physical touch. Please continue to practice social distancing as best as possible. The CDC recommends 3 feet of distance between households and people. Avenue continues to provide hand sanitizer throughout the building to help reduce the spread of germs.

We love seeing each of you on Sunday mornings. Let us continue to do our part to make it possible for us to come together in-person for worship. Let us not grow weary of doing good and caring for our neighbors around us.

Hands-on UMCOR Relief Hygiene Kits Project

In addition to providing funds to UMCOR, let's provide basic necessities to people who have been forced to leave homes due to flooding, tornados, hurricanes and more. UMCOR gives HYGIENE kits to many people and families inside and outside the United States. Two choices: 1.) make your own hygiene kit or 2.) bring some of the items needed. UMCOR understandably is very specific:

- All items must be new.
- Do not wash any items or they will no longer be considered new.
- Do not include any personal notes or additional materials in the kits.
- Contents of the kits or containers should not be imprinted with cartoon characters, advertisements, religious, patriotic, military or camouflage symbols.

Items Needed:

- **One hand towel** (15x25-17x27 inches) **No** kitchen, cleaning, or microfiber towels.
- **One Washcloth. No** kitchen, cleaning, or microfiber towels.
- **One comb**. Must be sturdy with at least 6 inches of teeth. **No** pocket combs or picks. Rattails and combs without handles are acceptable but must have at least 6 inches of teeth.
- One toenail or fingernail clipper. No emery boards or metal nail files.
- Bath size soap (3 0z. bar or larger. No Ivory or Jergens soap. Do not remove it from packaging.
- **One adult toothbrush**. Do not remove it from packaging. Personal advertising not acceptable.
- **10 adhesive bandages** (3/4 by 3 inches). Common household bandages acceptable.
- One one-gallon size resealable bag. All items are put in a bag.

Boxes will be available for you to deposit kits or items. Packing day to be announced. There is a **\$2.00 cost per kit** to cover the toothpaste UMCOR provides and shipping costs. **Collection ends October 10**th. This project is sponsored by the **United Methodist Women**.

Sleeping for babies

Sleep — or lack of it — is probably the most-discussed part of baby care. As new parents quickly learn, the quality and quantity of their baby's sleep affects the well-being of everyone in the household.

How Much Is Enough?

Sleep needs vary by age. Sleep is very important to kids' well-being. The link between a lack of sleep and a child's behavior isn't always obvious. Kids can become hyper, disagreeable, and have extreme changes in behavior. Here are some numbers based on age, with tips to help you get your child to sleep.

Babies (Up to 6 Months)

- · Newborns' internal clocks aren't fully developed.
- They can sleep up to 18 hours a day, divided about equally between night and day.
- Newborns should be wakened for feeding if they sleep more than 4 hours until they have good weight
- After those first weeks, infants may sleep for as long as 4 or 5 hours at a time
- At 3 months, a baby averages about 14 hours of sleep total, with 8–9 hours at night two or three daytime naps.
- Keep routine nighttime changes and feedings as quick and quiet as possible.
- Don't provide any unnecessary stimulation. Encourage the idea that nighttime is for sleeping.
- It's not too early to establish a simple bedtime routine.
- Any soothing activities (bathing, reading, singing) done consistently and in the same order each night can be part of the routine.
- The goal is for babies to fall asleep by themselves and learn to soothe themselves and go back to sleep if they wake up in the middle of the night.


Babies 6-12 Months

- At 6 months, babies still need an average of 14 hours of sleep a day
- two to three daytime naps, lasting anywhere from 2 hours to 30 minutes each.
- Some babies, particularly those who are breastfed, may still wake at night.
- If your baby wakes in the middle of the night, but you don't think it's due to hunger, wait a few
 minutes before going to your baby.
- Those who don't settle should be comforted without being picked up (talk softly to your baby, rub the back), then left to settle down again-unless they are sick. Sick babies need to be picked up and cared for.
- If your baby doesn't seem sick and continues to cry, you can wait a little longer, then repeat the short crib-side visit.
- Between 6 and 12 months, separation anxiety, a normal part of development, comes into play. But the rules at night are the same through a baby's first birthday: <u>https://kidshealth.org/en/parents</u>
