Dear Avenue Family,

As I sit in my office writing, 95 complete Thanksgiving meals are going out to their recipients, 49 of which went to families with students attending Milford Schools. A handful of our young adults are handing them out, Fusion students and leaders packed the boxes Sunday night as part of their annual Friendsgiving, and your generosity purchased the items in each box. Our Office Administrator, Kelly Hudson, ordered the food while Joanne Burbage and Kevin Chamberlain developed the list of the families we would assist through these meals. The Thanksgiving boxes are a great example of Paul's metaphor of the Church being a body. Many parts make up the body that works together towards a common goal. It is a blessing to see the fruit of the work of the people called Avenue.

I am thankful for the people who make up Avenue Church and the commitment to engage in ministry with one another and the community around us. This summer, the children (and parents) of Vacation Bible School raised over \$800 to support families in Guatemala. A generous donation enabled us to purchase a tent to do creative ministry outside this past summer and in the summers to come. The United Methodist Woman raised over \$10,000 through a re-imagined yard sale and Holiday Fair. Health Ministries have been vital during the pandemic in keeping us healthy and informed. Our ability to hire our Pastor of Congregational Care has increased our connectedness over the last few months. We have four small groups learning about Discipleship during the Fall, with two Advent Studies beginning next week. As our world emerges from a pandemic, Avenue continues to respond with creativity, generosity, and faith. This Thanksgiving, I am thankful for the ways our congregation has responded to the challenges of the past twenty months. Your generosity had allowed us to move forward at a time when other churches and businesses had to hit the "pause" button. I believe that we will have opportunities to grow in our ability to follow Jesus and in our ministry to the world around us in the coming months. I hope that we will be able to round out our staff to help equip our laity for God's work for us. We will address some building issues to ensure this facility remains a vital tool for worship and disciple-making. In this new world, we have the opportunity to envision how Avenue can be a fruitful congregation for the next 10-15 years.

For this to happen, we will need your continued support in the work of the church. We need people who will pray daily for our church, our staff, and our ministries. We to develop the leaders we have and new leaders to engage in new forms of ministry in the months and years to come. We will need continued financial support as well. As we seek to grow as a church, we will need to expand our financial health.

November is Lung Cancer Awareness Month-Scanning for Lung Cancer

Did you know:

- 90% of lung cancer is caused by smoking
- Non-smokers subjected to second-hand smoke are at a 20-30 % increased risk of developing lung cancer in their lives (This includes childhood exposure)
- Low Dose Cat Scan (LDCT) screening is now widely available to detect lung cancer at the early stages when outcomes are greater (must meet guidelines for screening to be paid for by insurance/Medicare.)
 - o Age 55-77
 - o Current smoker or former smoker who quit in last 15 years
 - Smoked at least 30 pack years (1 pack per day for 30 years, 2 packs per day for 15 years etc.)
 - No symptoms of lung cancer
 - o No previous chest CT scans in the past year

These guidelines will change in 2022 and will reduce pack years smoked and adjust age to 50-80, but currently Medicare and insurance companies are not paying at these new recommended guidelines.

• Lung cancer treatment has made many great advances in recent years. Targeted therapy to match individual's cancer cells can provide cure and /or many years of quality survival.


