Who Is Your One?

We are just over a week away from our first Christmas Eve service. I'll admit, after having to go virtual last year for Christmas Eve, I am excited to gather with the Avenue community to celebrate and worship together.

Earlier this month, Avenue sent out 10,000 postcards to the Milford community and engaged in advertising our Christmas Eve services on social media. There are statistics that show that engaging in a mailing campaign has a low return, though historically, Avenue has had a good return. While a postcard or social media post are a good way to get our name, website, or worship services times out into the community, it is an impersonal way to invite people to church.

What should we do?

The most effective way to bring people to church is to invite our friends and family members who have no church. Lifeway Research had a statistic out a while back that said "71% of people said they would go to church with a trusted friend or family member." Seventy-one percent! Just like we follow the recommendations of family and friends when it comes to finding a new restaurant or plumber, we listen when a friend tells us about their church.

Since stores started playing Christmas music back in October, our friends and neighbors have heard about silver bells, jingle bells, and flying reindeer. They have also heard about drummer boys worshipping Jesus, about angels declaring

good news to shepherds, and that there is joy in the world. People's hearts and minds are primed and open to come to a Christmas Eve service and to hear about the HOPE that we have in Jesus.

Who is your one? Who are the family members and friends that you have who do not have a church that you could invite to a Christmas Eve service? When you do invite them, remember to meet them in the parking lot or the door so they don't have to walk in alone. Show them where the restrooms are. Help them with their communion cups or candles. When the service ends, thank them for coming and invite them back again for Sunday worship.

We cannot keep the good news about Christmas to ourselves. Let us make every effort to share God's love to everyone we meet. I look forward to seeing you and your friends on Christmas Eve!

Our Lord provides us comfort...

Jesus wept. John 11:35

It's a repeated reminder in the counseling room.... To stay healthy, we need to exercise both. Because God gave us our emotions, we feel, and because we live in a physical world, we feel attachment to the people and the things in our life experience. This is not wrong or inappropriate, but understandable. Remember, God did not create us as robots, but flesh and blood, with feelings. That said, it is healthy to make emotional attachments to those we connect with in this brief life; we give and we receive through our connections; we love and are loved. We gain from our connections and we lose when our connections are no more. It is as if a part of us is missing when we lose that special person from our lives.

A picture that often comes to mind with loss is that of a hot air balloon, anchored by ropes to remain secure on the ground, and then one of the important tethers is broken, a connection is lost, and the balloon, formerly secure and grounded, is now off-kilter, unbalanced, and struggling to find its bearings. A life that appeared certain and understood is now in flux and unpredictable. We have experienced loss and we are hurting, sad, broken, and confused. Jesus wept, and so do we.



Only Jesus can represent both the human and sacred all in one scene, and He did just that for Mary and Martha, His good friends; He does the very same for you and me as well. Aside from His tears, Jesus gave His friends the solid strength of His presence, a comfort to the hurting, as Mary and Martha began to look at life for the first time without their brother Lazarus. In essence, where the solid rope of Lazarus was gone, it was Jesus, who in normalizing their tears with His own, rebalanced their world while they began to grieve the loss of their irreplaceable brother. Our Lord doesn't remove our need to grieve. This is a human requirement as vibrant, thoughtful creatures who live and love in the course of life. Our Lord merely brings the balance, the strength....the comfort we so desperately need as a new chapter of our life story unfolds. Through our tears that both cleanse and relieve our hurt inside, may we "have the eyes to see and the ears to hear"; to sense the Lord's comforting presence which brings new balance to our journey ahead....Amen
