#### 2020 Lay Laureate Award | Dave and Bev Reynolds



Our 2020 Lay Laureate Award winners arrived in Milford about 6 years ago and have become immersed in activities and ministries not only at Avenue but also throughout the Milford community. They both volunteer at the Milford Community Food Pantry and serve on our Greeter team. Dave Reynolds has led a Bible Study and is always involved in the Methodist Men's Pancake Breakfast. During the Yard Sale, Bev Reynolds has played an integral role in the Clothing area and Dave has lent his muscle to hauling items and many other needs. About 4 years ago they both participated in the Walk to Emmaus.

They serve the community through the Milford Lions Club where Dave is currently President and Bev on the Board of Directors. Bev coordinates service to the Veterans home and Union Cemetery as well as being responsible for Eyeglass Collection. They both are highly involved in the Lions Spaghetti Dinner and frequently volunteer at the monthly Mobile Food Pantry Distribution in Georgetown. Additionally, Bev volunteers at Bayhealth Sussex Campus and Dave at the Milford Public Library. Whatever job needs done whether it be at Avenue or in the community, they are always willing servants.

#### 2019 Lay Laureate Award | Tom Chilton



Our 2019 Lay Laureate recipient likely holds the record for most nights spent asleep at Avenue Church. Tom Chilton, and his wife Henrietta, came to Avenue in 2007. It did not take long for Tom to get involved in the church and in serving the community. He has worked in the Reading Assist, mentoring Elementary students for 9 years. He has helped prepare Income Taxes through AARP for Senior Citizens for more than a decade. Tom serves his HOA and helps his neighbors by fixing lawn mower and other maintenance tasks. Tom also serves with Meals on Wheels.

Tom is maybe most known for his work with CODE PURPLE. CODE PURPLE is a cold weather shelter here at Avenue for homeless men in our community. Tom has spent many nights, including last night, here at the church so that these men have a place to stay. Any time I run into a guest who has acquired housing after Code Purple, they always ask how Mr. Tom is doing.

Henrietta asked Tom why he serves in so many ways and Tom replied, "Life has been so good to me, so I have to give something back. It is the right thing to do."

As we continue to roll-out the Discipleship Pathway, living out our faith through serving is integral to the life of a disciple and the church. We are committed to developing ministries that

meet the physical and spiritual needs of our neighbors in Milford and beyond.

# Trustees Approve Replacing Office/Portico Roof and HVAC

If you've been on the backside of the church office suite, you may have noticed that the portico roof is in severe disrepair. That's probably being generous as parts of the roof are falling in. This is not only a safety hazard, but an insurance liability as well.





The portico is the porch between the sanctuary and the choir room, but the roof extends over the church offices which go all the way to the catwalk. This section of roof will need to be taken off and replaced. In addition, the HVAC system that sits on top of that same roof is around 20 years old. This system provides air conditioning for the sanctuary and offices. It frequently failed last summer.

The Trustees have approved the replacement of both the roof and the HVAC system. This will cost an estimated \$185,000. Church Council has approved the reallocation of \$135,000 earmarked for upgraded flooring in the Education Wing to the Portico Roof/HVAC project. The balance of the project can be paid out of our Building Fund.

As the project would deplete our Building Fund, the leadership at Avenue will be looking at ways to raise funds for the building to ensure that we can keep the building in good repair. Our facility is large and in regular need of maintenance and upgrades. There will be a date in the month of February to hear more about this project and other possible projects that the Trustees are working on.

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# Healthy living Fast facts on calorie intake and use

- Recommended calorie intake depends on factors such as age, size, height, sex, lifestyle, and overall general health.
- Recommended daily calorie intakes in the US are around 2,500 for men and 2,000 for women.
- Eating a big breakfast could help with weight reduction and maintenance.
- The brain uses around 20 percent of the energy used in the human body.
- Factors affecting ideal calorific intake include age, bone density, and muscle-fat ratio.
- A 500-calorie meal consisting of fruits and vegetables has more health benefits and will keep you feeling full for longer than a 500-calorie snack of pop <a href="https://www.medicalnewstoday.com/articles/245588#recommended-intake">https://www.medicalnewstoday.com/articles/245588#recommended-intake</a>

Activity	Calories burned
Lifting weights	90
Aqua aerobics	120
Walking at 4.5 miles an hour	150
General swimming	180
Running at 6 miles an hour	300
Computer work	41
Sleeping	19

## TIPS for eating

- Eat three healthy meals a day (breakfast, lunch, and dinner); dinner does not have to be the largest meal.
- The bulk of food consumption should consist of healthy foods, such as fruits, vegetables, whole grains, and fat-free or low-fat milk products.
- Incorporate lean meats, poultry, fish, beans, eggs, and nuts into a healthy diet.
- Choose foods that are low in saturated fats, trans fats, cholesterol, salt (sodium), and added sugars;
- Control portion sizes; eat the smallest portion that can satisfy hunger and then stop eating.
- Healthy snacks are OK in moderation and should consist of items like fruit, whole grains, or nuts to satisfy hunger and not cause excessive weight gain.
- Avoid sodas and sugar-enhanced drinks
- Do not eat to relieve depression
