Family Health History of Colorectal (Colon) Cancer

Having a family health history of colorectal cancer makes you more likely to get colorectal (colon) cancer yourself.

Lynch syndrome, also known as hereditary non-polyposis colorectal cancer (HNPCC), is the most common cause of



hereditary colorectal (colon) cancer. Lynch syndrome is due to inherited changes (mutations) in genes that affect DNA mismatch repair, a process that fixes mistakes made when DNA is copied. Colorectal cancer also can be caused by mutations in genes other than those related to Lynch syndrome. This means that some families with a history of colorectal cancer will not have mutations in a Lynch syndrome gene. These mutations might be picked up through genetic testing using multigene panels, which look for mutations in several different genes at the same time.

People with Lynch syndrome are more likely to get colorectal cancer and other cancers, and at a younger age (before 50), including:

- · Uterine (endometrial),
- · Stomach,
- · Liver.
- Kidney,
- · Brain, and
- Certain types of skin cancers.

Knowing your family health history of colorectal cancer and sharing this information with your doctor can help you take steps to lower your risk. If you have multiple relatives who have been diagnosed with colorectal cancer or relatives who have been diagnosed at a young age (before age 50), your doctor may change your medical management to prevent colorectal cancer or catch it as early as possible. If you have been diagnosed with colorectal cancer, it is important to tell your family members.

Based on current recommendations, most people start colorectal cancer screening at age 50, but if you have a family history your doctor may recommend the following:

- Colonoscopy starting at age 40, or 10 years before the age that the immediate family member was diagnosed with cancer.
- More frequent screening,
- · Colonoscopy only instead of other tests, and
- · In some cases, genetic counseling.

If you are concerned about your personal or family health history of colorectal cancer, talk to your doctor. Office of the Associate Director for Science (OADS), Genomics and Precision Public Health


