I am still reeling over the news of the massacre that took place at the Tops Grocery Store in Buffalo, NY over the weekend. An 18 year-old gunman traveled 200 miles to a predominantly Black neighborhood and fatally shot 10 people, most of whom were Black. There were reports that his weapon had a racial slur written across it, as well as penning a 180-page manifesto with racist rhetoric. This hate-filled act, along with others like it, are especially heinous.

In our Baptismal Vows, we promise to "resist evil and oppression in whatever forms they present themselves." This speaks to spiritual oppression as well as resisting and standing against other forms of oppression, such as racism. As **Christians, we must denounce all forms of racism and violence based on race. We must seek to eliminate the systems that enable racism to exist. We must stand with those who are oppressed and marginalized.** We are called to a ministry of reconciliation (2 Corinthians 5:16-21) that brings people to God while restoring right relationships between people. As a predominantly White congregation, we must intentionally stand beside our brothers and sisters of color, listen and learn from their experiences, and actively work alongside them for a better future.

The Creation account in Genesis reminds us that all humans are created in the image of God. Every human has sacred value and worth. Paul tells us in Galatians 3:28 that,

"There is neither Jew nor Gentile, neither slave nor free, nor is there male and female, for you are all one in Christ Jesus."

As beings created in the image of God, and through our faith in Christ, we are to see no difference in our neighbor whether across the street or around the world. We do, however, see distinctions. These distinctions can make our communities stronger as we learn from and grow with one another.

Avenue United Methodist Church has long been a leader within the Milford community. The time is now for the people of Avenue to be leaders in the work of reconciliation in our community. This is more than saying the right words, but living a lifestyle of reconciliation. Let us prayerfully seek ways that we can sit "knee-to-knee" to listen and learn from our neighbors in order that we might also stand "shoulder-to-shoulder" in the work that must be done.

Prostate Cancer

Prostate cancer is one of the most common types of cancer. Many prostate cancers grow slowly and are confined to the prostate gland, where they may not cause serious harm. However, while some types of prostate cancer grow slowly and may need minimal or even no treatment, other types are aggressive and can spread quickly

Signs and symptoms of prostate cancer include:

- None in early prostate cancer
- Difficulty initiating urinary stream
- Decreased force in the stream of urine
- Blood in the urine and/or semen

In advanced prostate cancer:

- Bone pain
- Low back pain or pain in the thighs
- Erectile dysfunction

Risk factors for prostate cancer are:

- Age- risk increases with age, most commonly after age 50.
- Race- African American's are at a significantly higher risk, and more likely to be aggressive or advanced, however, any man can be affected.
- Family history- having a blood relative, especially father or brother with prostate cancer or a family history of BRCA1 or BRCA2 genes, or a very strong history of breast cancer, risk for prostate cancer is increased.
- Obesity- increases risk.

American Urological Association Guidelines for Prostate Cancer Screening

- For men aged 55 or younger
 - Average risk- no screening is recommended
 - Higher risk- (African American, family history of prostate, male and female breast cancer, ovarian, pancreatic in first-degree relatives, and that developed at younger ages)individualize screening decision.
- For men ages 55 to 69- screening after shared decision making to include the risks and benefits of screening. This age group has greatest benefit of screening.
- For men age 70 and over or any man with a life expectancy of 10-15 years, PSA screening is not recommended. Men over 70+ who are in excellent health may benefit from prostate cancer screening.

To reduce the harms of screening, a routine screening interval of 2 years or more may be preferred over annual screening. This may preserve the majority of the benefits and reduce overdiagnosis and false positives of more frequent testing. Additionally, intervals for rescreening can be individualized by a baseline PSA level. . <u>https://www.cancer.org</u>
