This Sunday, we will learn what *not to do* when we encounter storms in our own lives.

I know it is summer and that means we are in a new rhythm with our families

and our schedule. I want to encourage you to make worship a priority throughout the summer. As we journey with Jonah and invite the Holy Spirit to work in our lives, it will be a *whale of a time!*




10:00 a.m. @ Church Sisters Bible Study. On June 21st we will continue our study "Words of Life" by Adam Hamilton.

If your child has one or more of these signs, don't delay - call 911 or the emergency system.

If it looks or feels like a stroke, it may be one.

Additional Warning Signs in Children:

- · Sudden severe headache, especially with vomiting and sleepiness
- · Sudden numbness or weakness on one side of the body (face, arm and/or leg)
- · Sudden confusion, difficulty speaking or understanding others
- Sudden trouble seeing in one or both eyes
- · Sudden difficulty walking, dizziness, loss of balance or coordination
- · New onset of seizures, usually on one side of the body

FACTS TO KNOW



Signs of stroke are often missed in children and teens because of LACK OF AWARENESS.



About half of children who had a stroke had a PREVIOUSLY IDENTIFIED RISK FACTOR.



Stroke is one of the **TOP 10 CAUSES** OF DEATH in children in the U.S.
